Spirited effort falls short for Stouffville

The Spirit of Stouffville was able to keep up with the soaring Newmarket 87's for two periods of Saturday's Provincial Junior A Hockey League game at the Rec Centre.

But the roof fell in on the struggling Stouffville squad during the final 20 minutes as the runaway Phillips Division leaders exploded for six goals to take an 8-2 victory.

The teams played a scoreless opening period, with Geoff Smith and Ben Javkovic scoring for the Spirit in a second period which ended with the score tied 2-2.

But the 87's, who had lost their first game of the season two nights earlier against the Orillia Terriers, took the lead on a power play marker on the first shift, then never looked back.

The Newmarket crew would add another pair of goals with the man advantage, in addition to a trio of even strength tallies.

"We played well in the first two periods," said Spirit head coach

Steve Sedore, who praised the work of Spirit goal keeper Ryan Spiteri.

"It was an entertaining game until the third. But those power play goals made the difference."

Sedore said his team lineup was depleted by injuries, with no possibility of calling up players from their Junior C affiliate Georgina Ice because the Ice was also playing Saturday night.

"We only had three lines. We simply ran out of gas."

Sedore was pleased with the performances of defenceman Jeff Marshall and Smith, who is the team's leading scorer.

Sedore said his team will be out to get back in the playoff hunt when it takes to the ice for three games this week.

The Spirit were to travel to Peterborough Tuesday and Orillia Thursday before returning home to host the Lindsay Muskies Saturday at 7:30 p.m.

"We've got to put some wins together this week. We need to take two of these three games to get back into it. It's pretty much a must win situation."

Minor peewees rally to earn tie

The Stouffville Legion minor peewee Clippers fought back from a 2-0 deficit to tie the Uxbridge Stars 2-2 Friday at the Rec Centre.

The Stouffville squad got goals from Rob Hopper and Brillinger in an opening game 4-2 loss to Georgina.

Marcus D'Annuzio, Cam Davis and Brillinger scored to lead the team to a 3-1 win over Caledon in game two.

Brillinger had the lone Clippers goal in a 2-1 playoff defeat at the hands of the host team.

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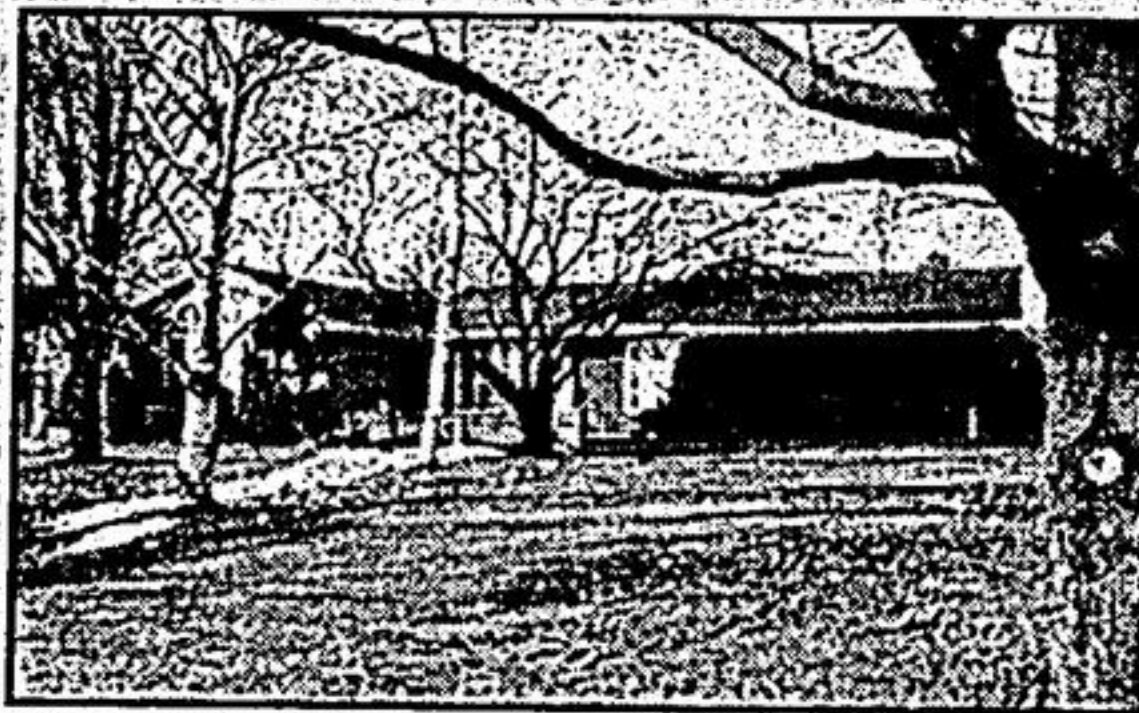
