

# Junior Spartans get caged by Cardinal Carter in semi-finals

The Stouffville District Secondary School (SDSS) Spartans junior girls' basketball team couldn't get it together in their York Region Athletic Association semi-final last Wednesday in Vaughan.

The Spartans, who had looked impressive in winning their first two playoff round games against Brother Andre and St. Elizabeth C.H.S., were downed 42-31 by Cardinal Carter C.H.S.

The loss eliminated the SDSS squad from further play.

The Spartans managed to stay even with their Cardinal Carter opponents in the first

quarter, then trailed by four at the half. But the SDSS crew came up flat in the final two quarters of play.

Spartans coach Al Piette said it was a matter of the two teams going in different directions in the second half.

"In the third quarter they (Cardinal Carter) picked it up and we just couldn't get things going," said Piette.

"We came to within five points of them at one point, but we just kept making mistakes. I think the girls were a little frustrated."

Piette said he knew the team was in trouble when leading scorer Alison Crowder was held without a point in the opening half.

"But we still had a good season," said Piette. "We were in the top four in York Region."
