all events in which the railway has been involved.

A regular volunteer at information booths and on the little train, he will serve as curator of the railway museum at Uxbridge Station.

Politicians, so often the target of public frustration, came through for the railway.

Municipal councils and mayors in both communities put their support behind YDHRA and former MPP Larry O'Connor more than lived up to his reputation for community involvement.

He successfully introduced a Private Member's Bill into the legislature, giving the association the right to run the train, and later secured a

\$230,000 Jobs Ontario grant to offset costs.

When the first official run took place, it represented a double celebration, since Sept. 14, 1996 was the 125th anniversary of the Toronto-Nipissing line.

Beginning in 1997, the train will run weekends and holiday Mondays from Victoria Day until Thanksgiving.
