DICKSON HILL OPEN HOUSE

Dickson Hill Public School is holding an information session and open house Feb. 5 at 7:30 p.m. for parents of children entering Grade 1 in 1997, who are considering the French immersion program.

Students in the area served by Orchard Park, Summitview and Whitchurch-Highlands public schools are eligible for French immersion, an optional alternative provided by the York Region Board of Education. Students receive all their education in French from Grades 1 to 3, begin formal English studies in Grade 4 and are taught in English about 50 per cent of the time by Grades 7 and 8.

Teachers in the program are qualified second language specialists, who are either francophone or have equivalent fluency in French. During the evening, visiting parents can tour the school, meet some of the teachers and view present students' work. Registration forms will be available at the open house or parents can call the school at 640-2891 for forms and information. The deadline for the 1997/98 school year is March 6.

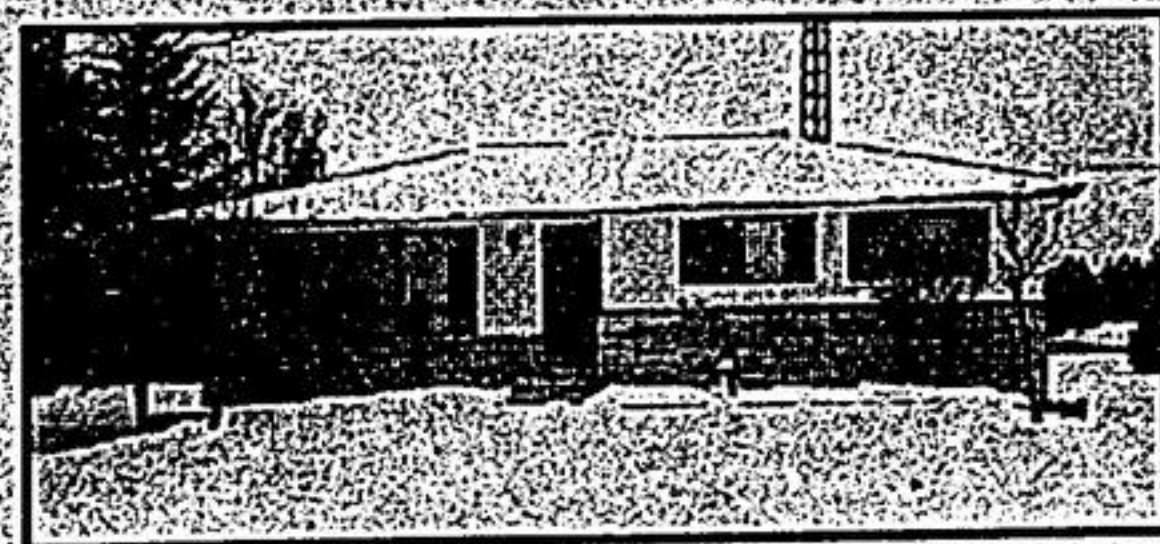
