# More than 500 new titles arrived last month

When new books arrive at your library, the desk and reference staff make a point of going through them. The staff members who habitually handle the front desk often get to know the reading preferences of regular patrons and are always on the lookout for new titles to recommend. The reference staff like to assess the information value of the non-fiction that arrives on the scene, what age it's aimed at and what subjects it covers.

January's influx of books has kept everyone busy, from the staff in the back room who process and get them ready

for circulation, right through to the patrons who are always eager to make their selections from the new acquisitions.
