Home show plans shaping up

Plans are well under way for the Whitchurch-Stouffville Chamber of Commerce Home Show, which takes place March 21 to 23 in the auditorium at Stouffville Country Market.

"We have 75 booths and we have already sold half," said Tribune office administrator Ruth Le Blanc, who is a director with the chamber.

"We're very pleased, because a lot more local businesses are getting involved this year."

The chamber is also working to attract companies from a wider area, she noted. "We're planning to have demonstrations, draws and a roulette wheel, and admission to the public is free."

Teen trial on tomorrow

The trial for one of the three teens charged with vandalizing the Stouffville Cemetery will resume in Newmarket tomorrow, on Feb. 13.

A judge set the trial date on Feb. 3. The 16-year-old Stouffville youths were all charged last spring after police discovered 42 headstones had been toppled and broken. Also flowers were trampled and beer bottles strewn about.

Business to continue

A gravel storage business will continue to operate from an industrial park in Vandorf despite objections from a local ratepayers group.


On Tuesday, Whitchurch-Stouffville council approved Norbett Properties Inc.'s zoning application to accommodate the aggregate transfer station which has been operating for at 109 Ram Forest Road for about eight years.

Christopher Dymond, spokesman for the Vandorf Ratepayers Association, told council the industrial park is such an eye sore people shy away from buying homes near it.

Councillor Ivanka Bradley voiced strong opposition to the plan, citing environmental concerns. Don Hindson, lawyer for Norbett, said the gravel storage unit is kept in an orderly state, employs 11 people and is a tax-paying asset to the community. Councillor Mike Watson suggests the town's bylaw officers carry out routine inspections to make sure the industrial park is not a mess. Since the business suffered a fire about two years ago, its owner plans to build a new office, warehouse building and gravel storage area.


