CD-ROM products make research easy, fast and fun

The question of the week at the library seems to be, "What's a Club Buck?" The answer is that it's a \$1 donation to the library and it works like this. You take the Club Buck to a Mr. Submarine, buy a Great Cana-

dian Club Sub and hand in the Club Buck. It's that easy.

You get a lunch and then Mr. Sub donates \$1 to the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library. So pick up your Club Bucks at the library.

While you're visiting the library, take a moment to try out the Canadian Encyclopedia on CD-ROM. This has just arrived and has been loaded on with the others CD-ROM products in the reference area. The library has four CD-ROM products, all loaded in one convenient location, which will get you started on your research projects.

If you're looking for a new fridge, or lawn mower, then use EMAS. This is an index to approximately 400 magazines and it also has the full text for 134 of these titles. Of course, this index also works with personal names, so if you'd like to see articles on favorite authors or movie stars, EMAS is also a good place to start your research. The Globe and Mail index is obviously a good place to

track down that newspaper article that went into the recycle bin. There's an added bonus with this product, too. It has not only The Globe and Mail, but it indexes a few other newspapers, and the full article is available.

The fourth CD-ROM answers one of our toughest questions. "I've read all of this authors books. What else is there?" The CD-ROM for this question is aptly named, "What Do I Read Next?"

You plug in the name of the author, and it first lists everything written by this person, and another quick function then searches for similar authors, or, similar titles of your favourite titles.

This new technology makes research almost fun. Try it out.

NOTICE OF MEETING

The Planning and Development Committee of the Town of Markham is holding a Public Meeting to consider an application by Law Development Group to amend Zoning By-law 177-96 for a portion of Phase 1 of the Cornell community.

BACKGROUND

A portion of Phase 1 of the Cornell community located on the east side of 9th Line north of the Markham-Stouffville Hospital, as shown on the key map below, is zoned by By-law 177-96. The by-law establishes land use categories and sets development standards. Law Development (Cornell) Group's proposed development sequence for Phase 1 and the proposed detailed building plans have resulted in their request to amend By-law 177-96 as follows:

1. extend the zoned area to include the residential area immediately north of the currently zoned area;
2. amend the development standards for the mixed use neighbourhood commercial building;
3. amend the side yard setback requirement for garages for townhouses on lanes to allow for groupings of up to a maximum of four such garages to be attached in sequence;
4. amend the development standards for lots along Ninth Line that back onto a public street rather than a lane, to allow the residential dwellings to "front" onto Ninth Line; and
5. amend the development standards for detached accessory buildings to permit coach houses to be located on all lots flanking a public street.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT

The purpose and effect of the proposed by-law amendments would be to facilitate the applicant's proposed development sequence and detailed building plans for Phase 1.

NOTE REGARDING ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Town of Markham in respect of the proposed zoning by-law does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Markham before the proposed zoning by-law is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.

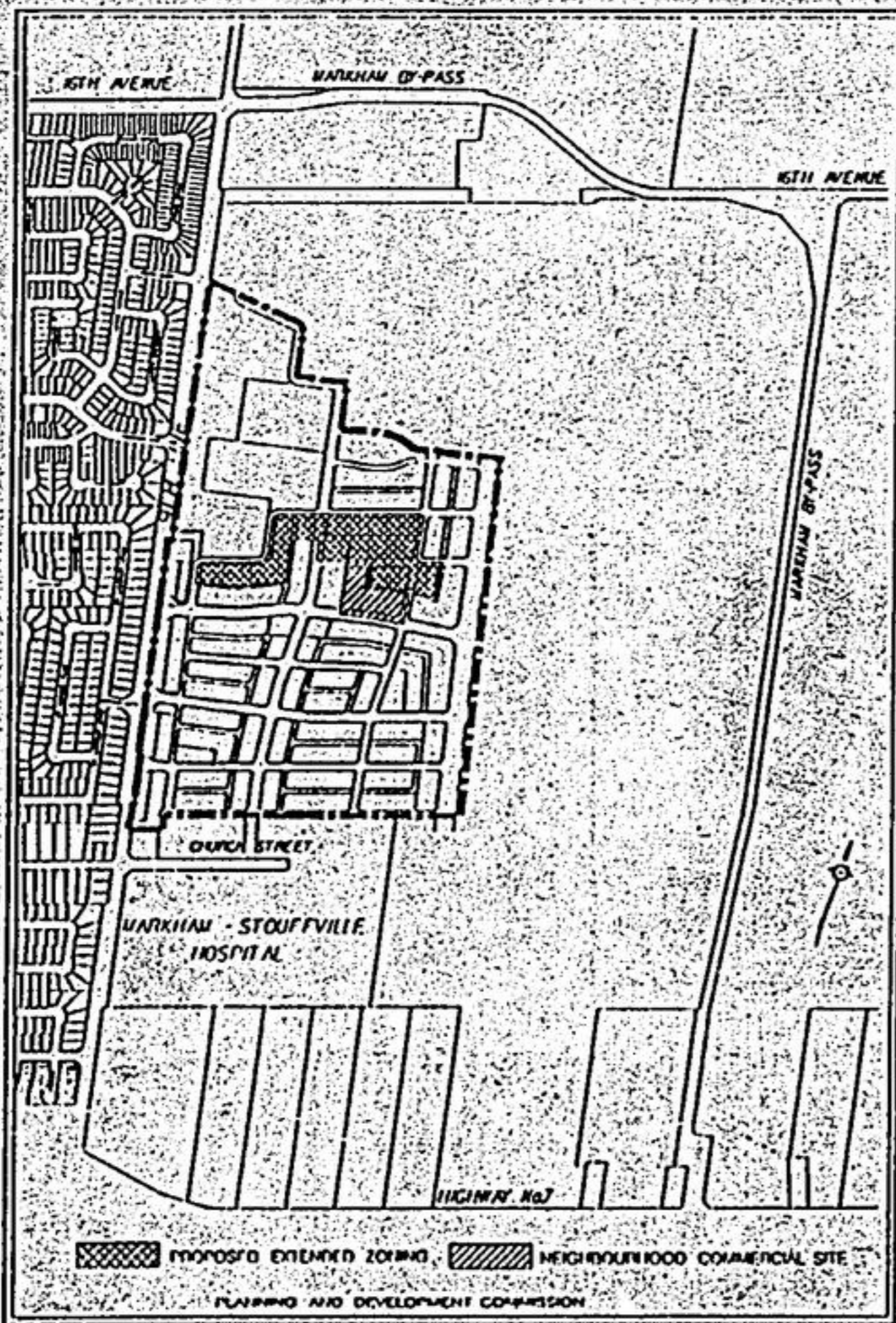
