

Michael Jones offers new wave in vinyl pools

Vinyl pools have come a long way - just ask Michael Jones of Jones Pools in Stouffville.

A life-long resident of the area, he has been in the vinyl pool business for 19 years and his new company specializes in installations, liner replacements and renovations. Other services include pool opening and closing, weekly maintenance, leak detection, water testing and landscape design.

"I ran the vinyl service and construction division for Betz Pools. The way these pools are built now, they are structurally every bit as good as concrete, and they're available in so many shapes and sizes," Jones said. Clients can also choose from a wide variety of decking materials, encompassing everything from black stone to brick copings, he said. "We have probably built 200 pools in Stouffville and that was the reason we came up with the idea of opening Jones Pools."

His office is located upstairs at Inside Out Decorating on Main Street, and he will soon be opening a retail outlet in the back portion of the store to sell chemicals and accessories and to provide free water testing for his customers. "We're renovation specialists, we've been working on older pools for years and we know where to find materials to replace what was there before. We also do replacement heaters, filters and other accessories. We're going to have a 24-hour emer-

gency pager that anybody can call after business hours."

When he's not building pools, Jones spends much of his time coaching minor sports. "I have coached hockey in this town for 12 years and baseball for nine or 10 years. I've been with these kids since they started and I really enjoy doing it."

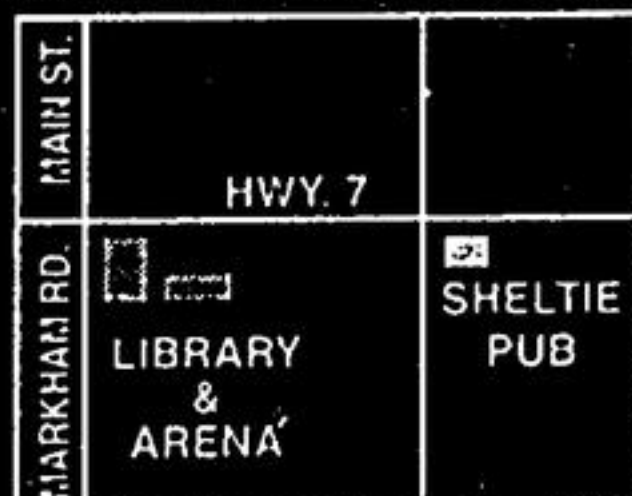

YORK Region ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

- BRIDGE REPLACEMENT - KENNEDY ROAD (Y.R. 3) APPROXIMATELY 60 METRES SOUTH OF VIVIAN ROAD (Y.R. 74), TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE
 - the replacement of the bridge on Kennedy Road (Y.R. 3) approximately 60 metres south of Vivian Road (Y.R. 74) over a tributary of the Black River in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville to provide for two lanes of traffic plus shoulders;
 - the carrying out of all related works and undertakings in connection with the above; and
 - the acquisition of the necessary lands, to a maximum right-of-way width of 33 metres, and interests in lands for the works described above.
- BRIDGE REPLACEMENT - STOUFFVILLE ROAD (Y.R. 14) APPROXIMATELY 180 METRES EAST OF KENNEDY ROAD (Y.R. 3), TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE
 - the widening of Stouffville Road (Y.R. 14) in the vicinity of the bridge over the Little Rouge Creek, approximately 180 metres east of Kennedy Road (Y.R. 3) and the replacement of the existing bridge with a new bridge providing for two lanes of traffic plus shoulders;
 - the carrying out of all related works and undertakings in connection with the above; and
 - the acquisition of the necessary lands, to a maximum right-of-way width of 33 metres, and interests in lands for the works described above.

Pursuant to Section 300 of the Municipal Act, the Transportation and Works Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 10:00 a.m. on the 19th day of March, 1997 in Committee Room A at the Regional Administrative Building located at 17250 Yonge Street, Newmarket, hear any person who claims that his/her lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard. Anyone wishing to be heard is requested to advise the Office of the Regional Clerk (telephone 895-1231 or 731-0201, ext. 1303). If any party entitled to be heard does not attend at the hearing the Committee may proceed in his/her absence and he/she will not be entitled to any further notice in the proceedings.

The proposed by-law and plans showing the proposed works may be inspected at the office of Brian Harrison, Director, Design and Construction Branch, at the Transportation and Works Department located at the Regional Administrative Building at 17250 Yonge Street, Newmarket (telephone 895-1200 or 764-6345, ext. 5088).
