A selection of new works by well-known local folk artist Sheila Maloney will be displayed at the Latham Gallery from March 16. Maloney's ancestors immigrated from Ireland in the 19th Century and her latest exhibition reflects her family's history and the story of their immigration, as well as exploring events in Ireland during the devastating potato famine of 1847-48. "This year is the 150th anniversary of the beginning of the Irish famine, and it is an event that had an important impact on Canada and North America, but the work goes beyond the specific Irish experience," said director/curator Christopher Jackson. An opening reception will be held at the gallery from 2 to 3:30 p.m. March 16.
