Protect Preston plan examined this week

Don't let Preston Lake and Vandorf get lost in some "megacity world," is the message from two local ratepayer groups.

Thanks to the efforts of area residents, including Chris Dymond, Bob McNeely and Chuck Cundari, a proposal designed to both recognize and protect Preston Lake and Vandorf, will be considered by Whitchurch-Stouffville Council as budget talks get under way this week.

Last week council agreed to, at least, look at a request for money to pay for a study. However, Mayor Wayne Emmerson suggested that such a study be put on hold for two months giving the province time to let municipalities know how changes will hit the local area.

Through the provincial Who Does What game plan, many municipalities and

regions will likely be touched by amalgamation, Emmerson said.

"There is a gray cloud hanging over all of the province," said Emmerson.

The trio from Pride and Preston Lake group and the Vandorf Ratepayers Association asked council to earmark funds for a Secondary Plan and Growth Management Study for the hamlets. A similar study, costing landowners \$300,000, has just been carried out for downtown Stouffville. It's been suggested that the study for the Preston Lake and Vandorf area would cost about \$150,000. McNeely said the north west hamlets which are home to about 1,300 people deserve to keep their residential make-up and not be lost to industrial and commercial growth. "Vandorf-Preston Lake is a small outpost in a relatively small muni-

city in our region," said McNeely. "Uncertain times are ahead for all of us as far as government is concerned. Our fear is that if we are not heard, understood and protected by you, this council, we will be a voice lost and irrelevant in some mega council world only Queen's Park has envisioned."

Planning is critical for the area, stressed Cundari. "Without planning, there would be haphazard growth, higher service costs and increased overall taxation. Many day to day problems would result from clogged streets, conflicting land uses and even dangerous living conditions," he warned.

Dymond emphasized the need to iron out specific plans for the area as well as the need to consult with residents. Dymond wants an advisory group struck to work with the town.
