Ethics code called for

Local council's decision to get rid of a hall board has prompted a request for the town to establish a code of ethics to deal with volunteers.

Tonight (Tuesday), Whitchurch-Stouffville Council will vote on a motion, presented by Ward 1 Councillor Ivanka Bradley, which calls for a code of ethics to be set up. Such a move is needed in order to "create good communications and to ensure that the town and its volunteers work in harmony," said Bradley.


The code should include a procedure to deal with disputes, thereby avoiding the dismissal of volunteers, said Bradley. An outside mediator should be made available to ensure impartiality, she added. Three weeks ago, Guy Castonguay, chairman of Latcham Hall Board, told *The Tribune* he was shocked, hurt and bewildered after council disbanded the board without any notice. Four of the board members share the chairman's sentiments. The remaining two are councillors. The duties of the hall board have been taken over by town staff.

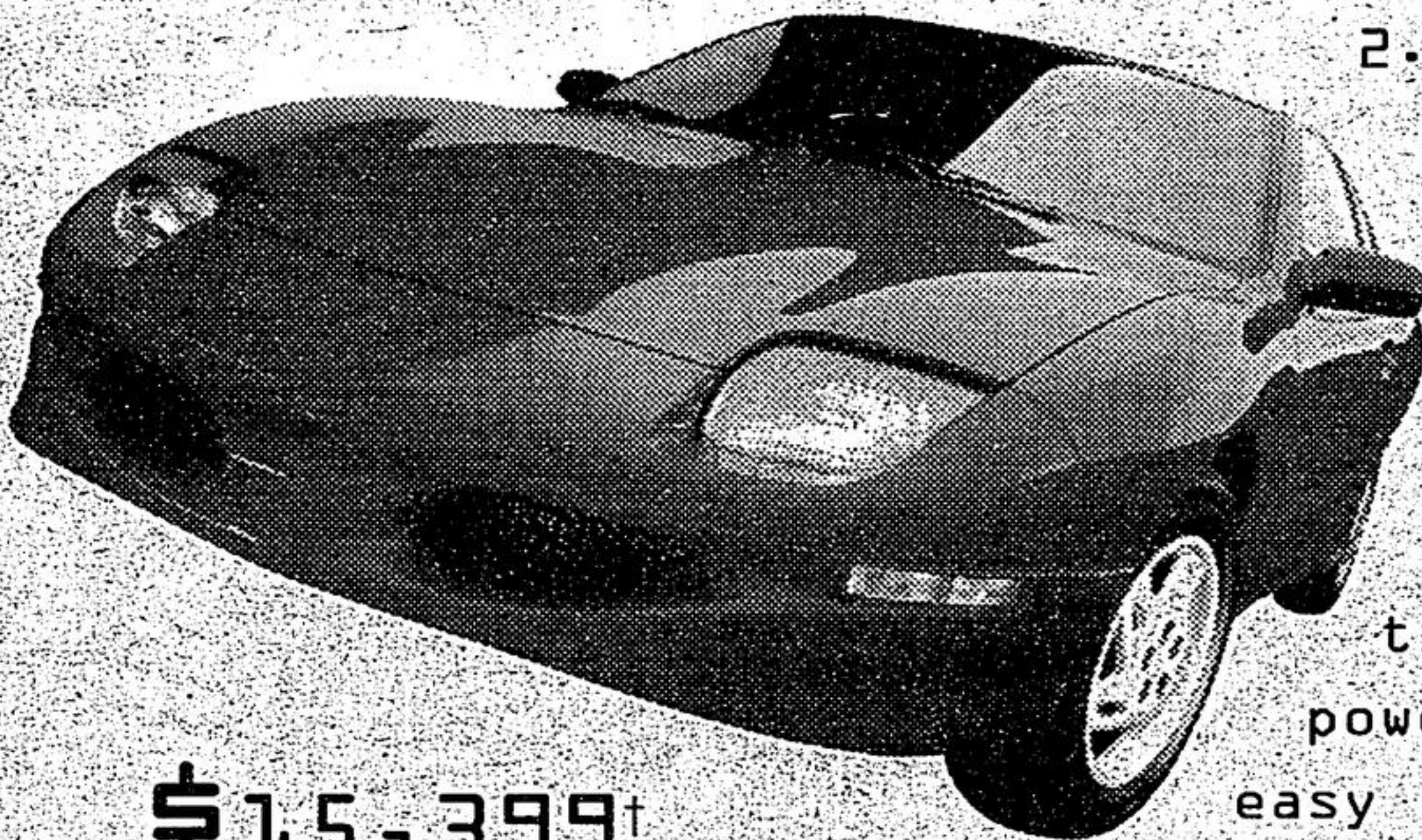

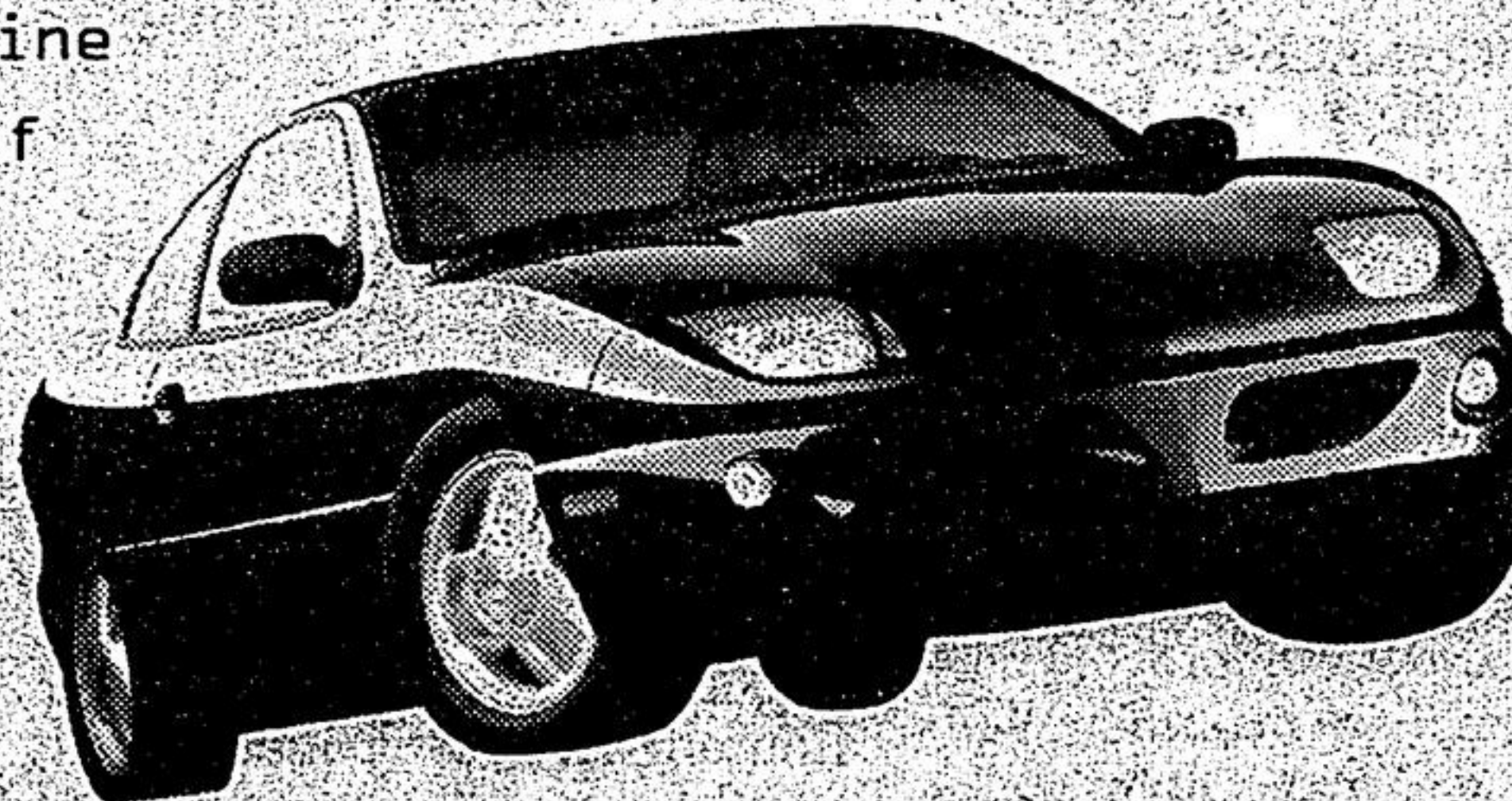
