## Group meets to combat plaza problem

Vandalism, excessive noise, garbage, drugs and gang fights are making life very difficult for the tenants of 16 apartments in Success Square Plaza.

Enough is enough, said Cathy Olive, tenant spokesperson.

Problems at the Main Street plaza are being hashed over at a tenants' meeting scheduled to be held at Sammy's Boot Bar and Grill on Monday.

"We're going to see if, collectively, we could help solve these

problems," said Olive. "It's so bad the police are here here almost every weekend."

The meeting was also to include plaza business owners.

On the weekend, Sandy Brown, plaza tenant, discovered fertilizer had been thrown inside her car and on top of the car hood.

"I'm waiting to find out if the car's been ruined. It's an older car, but it was my car and it worked up until now," said Brown.

The plaza area is going down hill fast, Brown added. The

## Charges in drowning at area golf course

Charges have been laid in connection with the drowning of a diver in Stouffville last June, confirmed a Ministry of Labour official.

Bob McClelland, communications officer for the ministry, said officials of Nearly New Golf Balls have been ordered to appear in a Newmarket court July 4.

Charged with failing to provide a diver with a life-line, failing to provide a tender and a stand-by diver, along with several other charges linked to inadequate supervision were laid against Michael McCauley, Lawrence B. McCauley and

company supervisor Gerard Voghel.

On June 10, 1996, Shawn Mitchell, 25, drowned at Spring Lakes Golf and Country Club while retrieving golf balls. Mitchell was a Seneca College student taking a diving course.

Dr. Peter Clark, York Region coroner, said a decision regarding an inquest into Mitchell's death and the drowning of another diver from Aurora in another incident, will be made after the Ministry of Labour has completed its processing.
