SAHL sign up for new season set for June 5

The Stouffville Amateur Hockey League is opening its doors to new players as it pares down to two age divisions for the 1997-98 campaign.

The men's league is to eliminate its 30 and over age division, with all players fitting into either the 20 and over group or the 40 and over flight.

He said he should have at least one assistant coach named by the end of this week, with another to follow.

Larmer said there should be over 85 players in attendance when the team holds its spring tryout camp from May 31 to June 1 at the Rec Centre's second ice pad.
