## Resident lost \$4,000 in scam

An Oshawa resident paid a phoney lawyer from Stouffville \$4,000 for a down payment on a house that wasn't for sale, police reported Tuesday.

When last week a Toronto judge sent David Kissen of Burkholder Street to prison for four years for fraud and passing himself off as a lawyer, interest in the case went beyond the Law Society of Ontario—Police fraud squads from Toronto, York and Durham as well as a host of victims, including one from Oshawa, paid very close attention.

Durham Regional Police detective Bob Schumacker said as a result of a complaint received by the police, it was learned that an Oshawa resident paid \$4,000 as a "deposit on a house" that was "later found to be not for sale."

Subsequent investigation revealed Kissen conned clients from Toronto and York, while four more victims, all Durham residents were uncovered. "The five (Durham victims) had paid a total of \$48,315 to a man who was representing himself as a lawyer with an office at 500 University Avenue, Toronto," said Schumacker.

Clients paid Kissen money for a variety of reasons, said Schumacker.

"In one instance, a victim was persuaded to pay \$8,000, supposedly to "buy off" a complainant in a criminal matter," he said.

Kissen, a first-time offender, got four years in prison on the Durham charges and two years on the Toronto charges.

The sentences are running concurrent.

Kissen also faces an \$85,000 compensation order. For a first-time offender, Kissen got a "hard sentence," said Toronto police fraud squad detective Chuck Vanderheyden.

It is not known if the victims including the Oshawa home shopper will ever recover their money. "It's (the order) is put on in case Kissen ever comes into any money," said Vanderheyden.

Kissen's Toronto victims include a professional hockey player, an automotive worker and a Scarborough man who paid Kissen \$40,000 in legal fees.

Kissen's phoney law practice took him to courts.

Along with clients, the judges were fooled.

While Kissen practised law out of his Stouffville home, his business cards listed a University Avenue, Toronto address as his place of business.

Section 50 of The Law Society Act, which deals with unauthorized practice, cleared the way for charges. Vanderheyden arrested Kissen outside a Toronto court about three years ago.
