

Numerous celebrations planned for Strawberry Festival

MUSEUM NEWS

Whitchurch-Stouffville Museum's 19th Century Nightlife exhibit will be on display until mid-September. The presentation includes examples of beds and bedding materials, advances in heating and lighting, and typical social and family activities of the 1800s.

The museum's Timber and Ties In Whitchurch-Stouffville, which features photographs, maps and artifacts tracing the community's timber and railway history, is on display at Queen's Park until Sept. 12. The exhibit is part of the Legislative Assembly Community Exhibit Program for 1997. Upcoming events at the museum include two Summer Children's Programs, July 23-25 and Aug. 20-22, in which children aged 8 to 14 will explore heritage activities and crafts during three half-day sessions. Participants can choose from

morning or afternoon classes and pre-registration is required. The fee is \$25 per session. The 24th Annual Antique and Classic Car Show takes place Aug. 10 (rain date Aug. 17) and features exhibitors from across southern Ontario. The museum will also host a model car contest for youth under 16 during the 1997 show. New this fall is the Hands-On Heritage Fall Fair Sept. 7, in which visitors can participate in a wide range of heritage crafts and skills

including butter and ice cream making, weaving, cross-cut sawing, augering and square dancing.

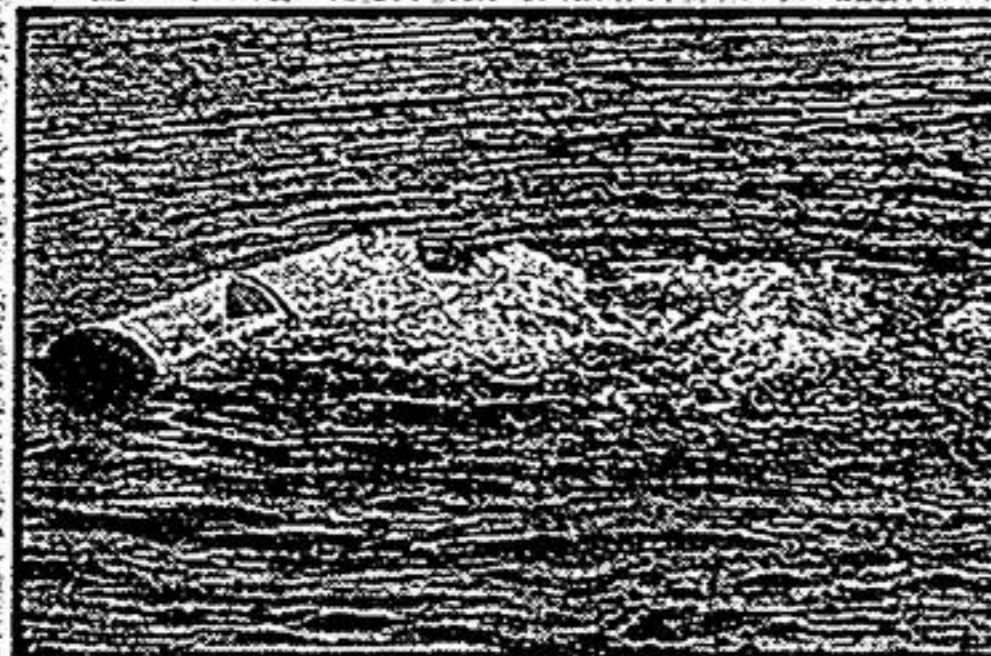

Owners of Java Junction Café in Stouffville opened up the large coffee house to fill a void.

"There is a lot of coffee shops, but no cafés," said Jason Kilmartin who owns the trendy shop located next to the Heritage Railway with Elli Alevritis.

Aimed at people of all ages, the pair stressed the café is not a teenagers' hangout and is open to anyone who wants to be served a fresh cup of coffee and a generous slice of gourmet cake or pastry.

Everything is different at Java Junction

From the extra large coffee mugs to the mini brown Betties, everything about the café is unique, said Alevritis. The café is made up of little rooms, each painted in bright colors with furniture ranging from wood tables and chairs to couches and a room with games.

People can sample cappuccino, flavored and iced coffees, herbal teas, flavored sparkling water, juices and more. They also serve both hot and cold lunches like soup, sandwiches, burritos and more.

"(We encourage) everyone to sit back and have coffee and dessert in a relaxed atmosphere," said Alevritis. "And the prices are reasonable."

"We dropped the prices so everyone is able to afford it," said Kilmartin.
