

# Police get tough on bad drivers on Ontario roads

The Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police (OACP) began its annual Aggressive Driving Campaign this week.

Maurice Pilon, chair of the OACP traffic committee, said law enforcement agencies will be focusing on the following areas for the next two weeks:

- At the local level, driving behaviors considered by the community to be the most hazardous of all moving violations

- At the national level, the ongoing concerns over drinking and driving and the failure to wear crash restraints.

Pilon is a chief superintendent

with the Ontario Provincial Police.

He said officers of all police services in Ontario have made an active commitment to reduce aggressive driving through enforcement and education.

As a result, he said, police can be expected to be especially vigilant in identifying violators, during this period of heightened community awareness and concern.

The 1997 Aggressive Driving Campaign continues until Sunday, June 22 and is officially endorsed by the Ontario Road Safety Partners.

The partners are: The Ontario Ministry of Transportation, Ontario Trucking Association, Insurance Bureau of Canada, Insurance Brokers Association of Ontario, and Ontario's police services.

## Scholarships available for students from farm families

## Ballantrae/Musselman Lake Area Water Distribution System Local Improvement

### Take notice that

1. The Council of The Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has constructed as a local improvement; watermain service connections, and necessary appurtenances thereto on streets in the Ballantrae / Musselman Lake area of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville.
2. The cost of the work is \$1,472,681.41 of which \$342,477.46 is to be paid by the Corporation of The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville. The special rate per metre frontage is \$25.53 (\$7.69 per foot). The cost for a service connection is \$505.19. The special assessment may be paid as a lump sum or in 10 annual installments at an annual rate of 7.25%.
3. The estimated lifetime of the work is 50 years.
4. A Court of Revision will be held on the 25th day of June at 9:30 a.m. at Latham Hall, 8 Park Drive Stouffville for the purpose of hearing complaints against the proposed assessments or the accuracy of frontage measurements and any other complaint that persons interested may desire to make that may be cognisable by the court.
