Lot's of new events

This year's Strawberry Festival offers more events than ever before. A lawn bowling tournament beginning at 1:30 pm Thursday at the local club will get things rolling.

In keeping with tradition the Stouffville Lions will serve up their beef barbecue between 5 pm and 7 pm in Memorial Park.

Local country and western singer Garry Wayne will entertain the crowds in the park between 7:30 pm and 8:30 pm.

The eighth annual Sacred Music Concert starts at 8 pm Thursday at the Stouffville Mission.

Friday's events include a echre tournament, free swimming and performances by children's entertainer Stephen Charles.

Stroll down Main St on Canada Day and take a look at some excellent original art.

The theme is Art on the Street, and the works in progress of a number of artists will be featured outside local stores, some of which will be open from 11 am.

Stage entertainment will begin at 2 pm in Memorial Park and continue through the day.

Pet Valu is sponsoring an all pets contest and finals for the cross cut saw challenge take place in Sangster's Grove at 2 pm.

The town pool will be open for swimming from 2 pm to 4 pm and the finals of the three-on-three basketball tournament begin at 3 pm.

Entertainers will wander through the park from 3 pm to 7 pm and at 5 pm country and western singer Garry Wayne will perform on the park stage.

Strolling musicians, sponsored by the Joseph

and Wolf Lebovic Foundation, will be featured from 6 pm to 6:40 pm and at 7 pm, the official Canada Day celebrations begin with the singing of the national anthem.

The Optimist Club's Teddy Bear Picnic starts at 7:10 pm and the giant birthday cakes will be cut at 7:30 pm, when the Dixieland Express Band, also sponsored by the Joseph and Wolf Lebovic Foundation, arrives to provide two hours of great musical entertainment in Thicketwood Park.

As darkness falls, fireworks will light up the sky in a grand Strawberry Festival finale.

Everyone is advised to bring lawn chairs for the laser light and fireworks spectacular, which will be presented by one of the companies involved in Ontario Place's Symphony of Fire.
