Pressure-treated wood lasts outdoors and is economical

More and more homeowners today are adding comfort, convenience and value to their homes and property with outdoor structures such as decks, fences, playground structures, vegetable gardens, planters and numerous other projects. Pressure-treated lumber, the wood most commonly used for these projects, is typically purchased because it lasts outdoors, it's economical and it is an environmentally-friendly

building material. But, like everything else, it does require some maintenance to keep it looking good. "One of the most often asked questions that consumers have is what maintenance is required to keep their pressure-treated wood looking good," said Mary Anne Kennedy, marketing coordinator of Hickson Building Products Limited. Pressure-treated wood provides long-term

protection against rot. However, protection is required to maintain the wood's appearance against weather. Sun and rain cycles cause stresses in lumber and result in swelling, shrinking, warping and cracking, which are natural characteristics of wood exposed to the elements.

To help protect your project against moisture damage, apply an effective brand of water repellent as soon as your project is finished. If you purchase water-repellent-treated wood, you can skip the initial application. When staining wood, follow the manufacturer's instructions. Wood should be dry for best results.

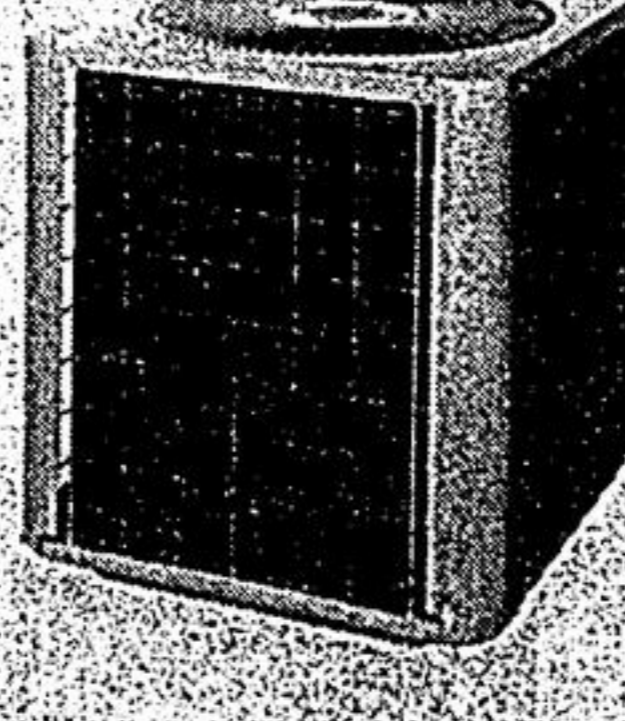
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
