Free swimming is offered at the town pool from 2 to 4 p.m. and artisans will demonstrate heritage skills from 2.30 to 6 p.m. in Sangster's Grove. Finals for the three-on-three basketball tournament begin at 3 p.m. in Memorial Park. Kids can take a pony ride in Sangster's Grove or work off excess energy on the inflatable carnival ride in Franklin Park from noon to 6 p.m. Country and western singer Garry Wayne will perform at Memorial Park at 5 p.m. and strolling musicians will visit Thicketwood Bowl from 6 to 6.40 p.m.
