The Metro Toronto and Region Conservation Authority is offering local landowners help to improve their property by providing free advice on planting and landscape design through a Metro Region Conservation Services Workshop.

"Private landowners owning a minimum of .8 hectares (2 acres) of land can improve plantings along stream banks and in river valleys, improve slope and soil stability or re-forest poor, unusable or marginal farm lands with hardy native plant materials," advised Zoltan Kovacs of the MTRCA nursery.

"The Private Land Tree Planting Program is intended to help private landowners improve their property and to promote private land stewardship."
