NOTICE OF WALKWAY OPENING

Proposed By-law to establish a public walkway between Kennedy Road and Windsong Court, described legally as Block 31, Plan 65M-2521

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Town of Markham intends to pass a by-law to establish a public walkway between Kennedy Road and Windsong Court over lands described legally as Parcel Walkway-1, Section 65M-2521, being Block 31, Plan 65M-2521, Town of Markham, pursuant to Section 300 of the Municipal Act.

The proposed by-law showing the walkway to be established may be viewed in the Clerk's Dept., Markham Civic Centre at 101 Town Centre Boulevard, Markham, at any time weekdays between 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The Council of the Town of Markham shall hear in person or by his/her Solicitor or Agent, any person who claims that his/her lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and applies to be heard at the hearing which will be held on Tuesday, August 19th, 1997 at 1:30 p.m.

I must also caution that there have already been talks of water restrictions for summer months, once we are all connected.

It certainly is nice to see the town acknowledge that there is a well contamination problem caused by high nitrates and bacteria. This problem has existed for more than 20 years.

What the article does not say is that the contamination is caused by too many septics and over population. All septics are designed to leach — that's what they are.

Staff, council and the mayor need to recognize and acknowledge this. Rather than ask you to

cap wells and plug holes, why not fix the problem, look at sewage and do something about it?

Unfortunately, even as a council member, I don't get information as fully as some other people do.

It would have been nice to be a part of those discussions and have tried to do something in Ward 2, where we need it because of population levels and continued contamination through more development with inadequate septic areas.

Instead, the main focus seems to be how can we put another 15,000 people in Stouffville and collect more revenues from them?

Yes, the region is picking up the cost of the well and tower, this is

the way government is supposed to work. We will pay into the pot the region is using to pay for the system with user fees and regional taxes. The province paid by way of a grant of 2/3 of the cost of the water system for the poor water quality. We all pay taxes and the government pools Ontario's money to pay for the grant.

It's too bad our town could not have done the same for us!


