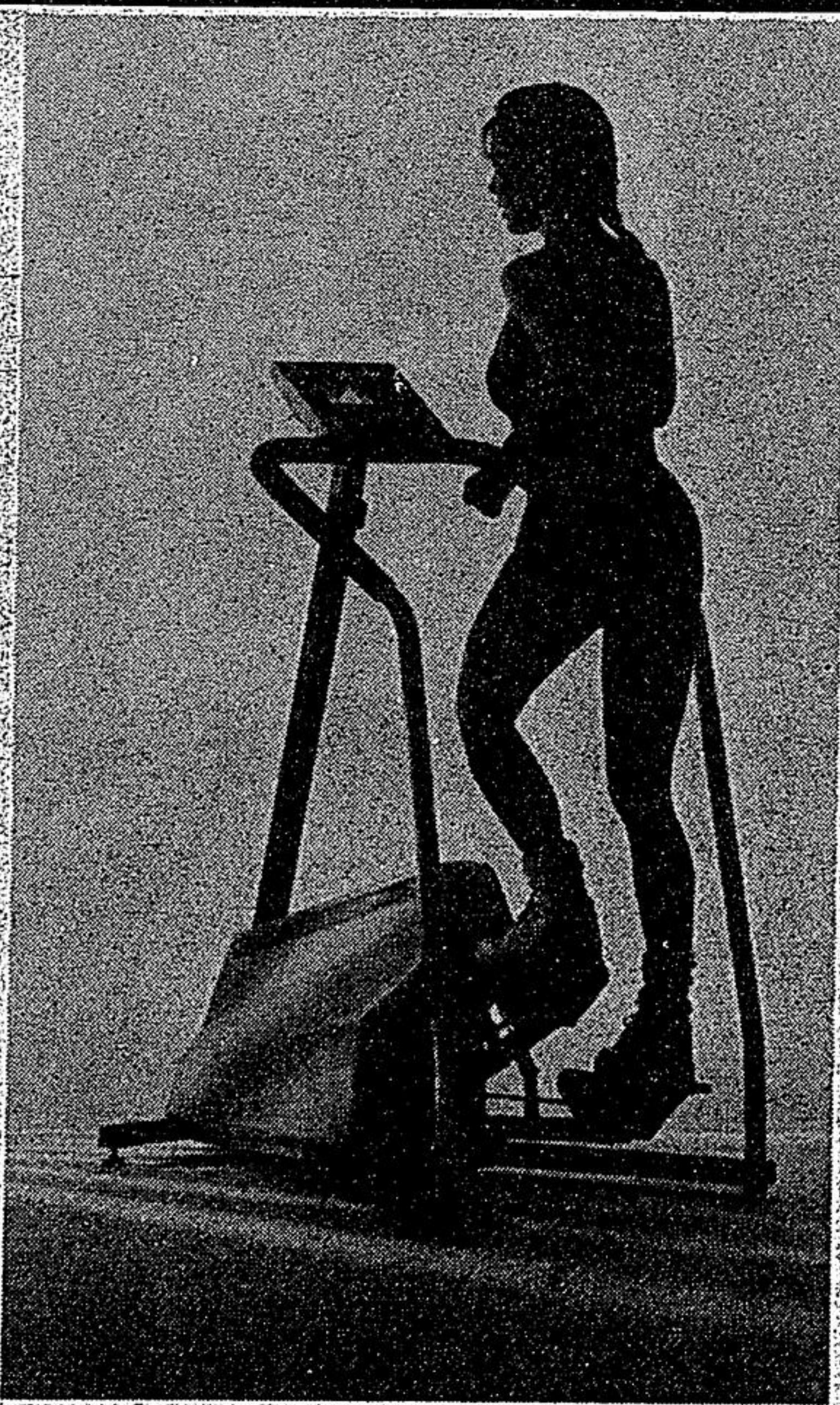

# Magazines a popular reading choice

A variety of magazines are displayed around the central lounge area of our library like psychedelic petals. The sense of being at the core of library action is very apt for a collection that has gained and sustained undisputed popularity with patrons over the years. This eclectic collection includes periodicals on home and garden, architecture, hobbies, social issues, enter-

tainment, sports, mechanics, computers, fashion and world affairs.

The collection attracts the browser and the borrower, the folk who like to relax and read the magazines in the library and the patrons who like to check them out on a regular three-week loan.

Magazine checkouts probably reflect the interests of patrons more than any other circulation information.

Top title in a June survey is *People Weekly*, closely followed by *Better Homes and Gardens*, *Canadian House and Home*, *Canadian Living*, *House Beautiful* and *Century Home*.

It doesn't take too much statistical savvy to conclude that women are the prime borrowers and that home and family is a major interest.

Other titles that are also popular with our patrons are *Toronto Life*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Rolling Stone*, *Psychology Today*, *Popular Science*, *National Enquirer*, *PC Magazine*, *Mad*, *Macleans* and *Architectural Digest*.

It was launched this spring to excellent reviews and will be published quarterly.
