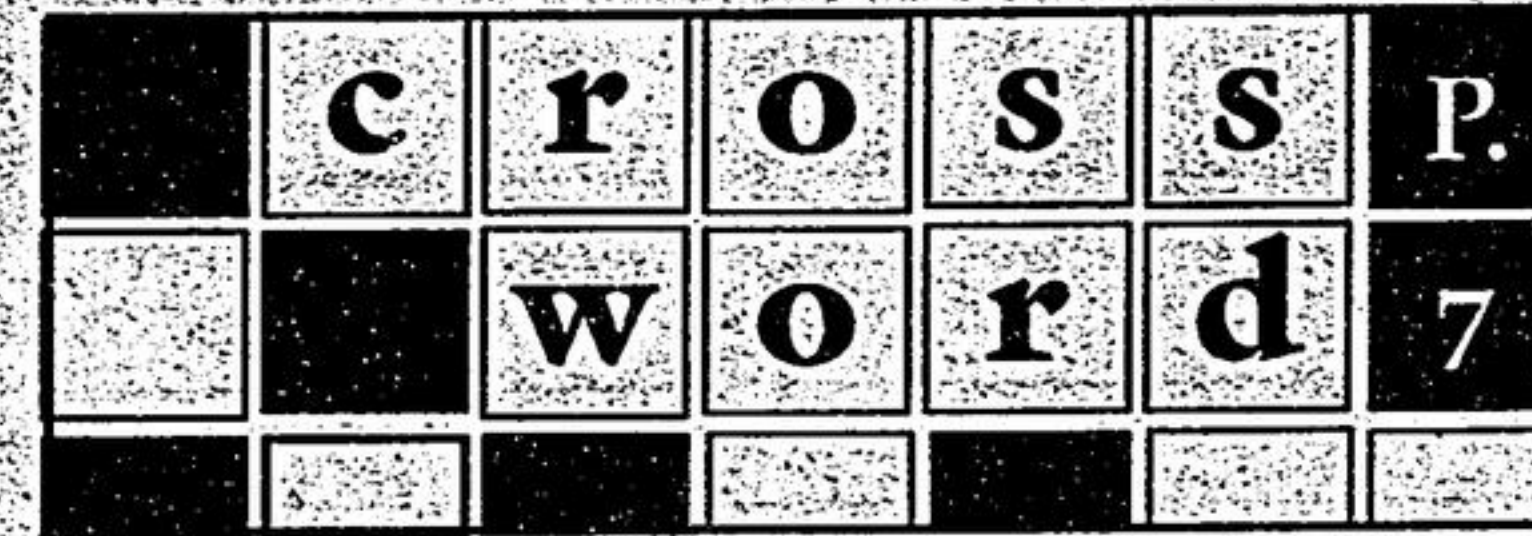

Home sought for hazardous waste

A search for a spot to build a household hazardous waste depot in Stouffville will be launched if York Council goes along with a

staff recommendation. *The Tribune* has learned.

Jeff Flewelling, York Region's waste management engineer, confirmed yesterday that a staff report scheduled to be made public Monday calls on the region to "go out

and identify" spots other than a Woodbine and St. John Sideroad location which was recently targeted to house the waste depot.

A York Regional committee and/or York Council has a number of options: The staff recommenda-

tion can be accepted, denied or altered. "Or, it could be taken off the table entirely," said Flewelling.

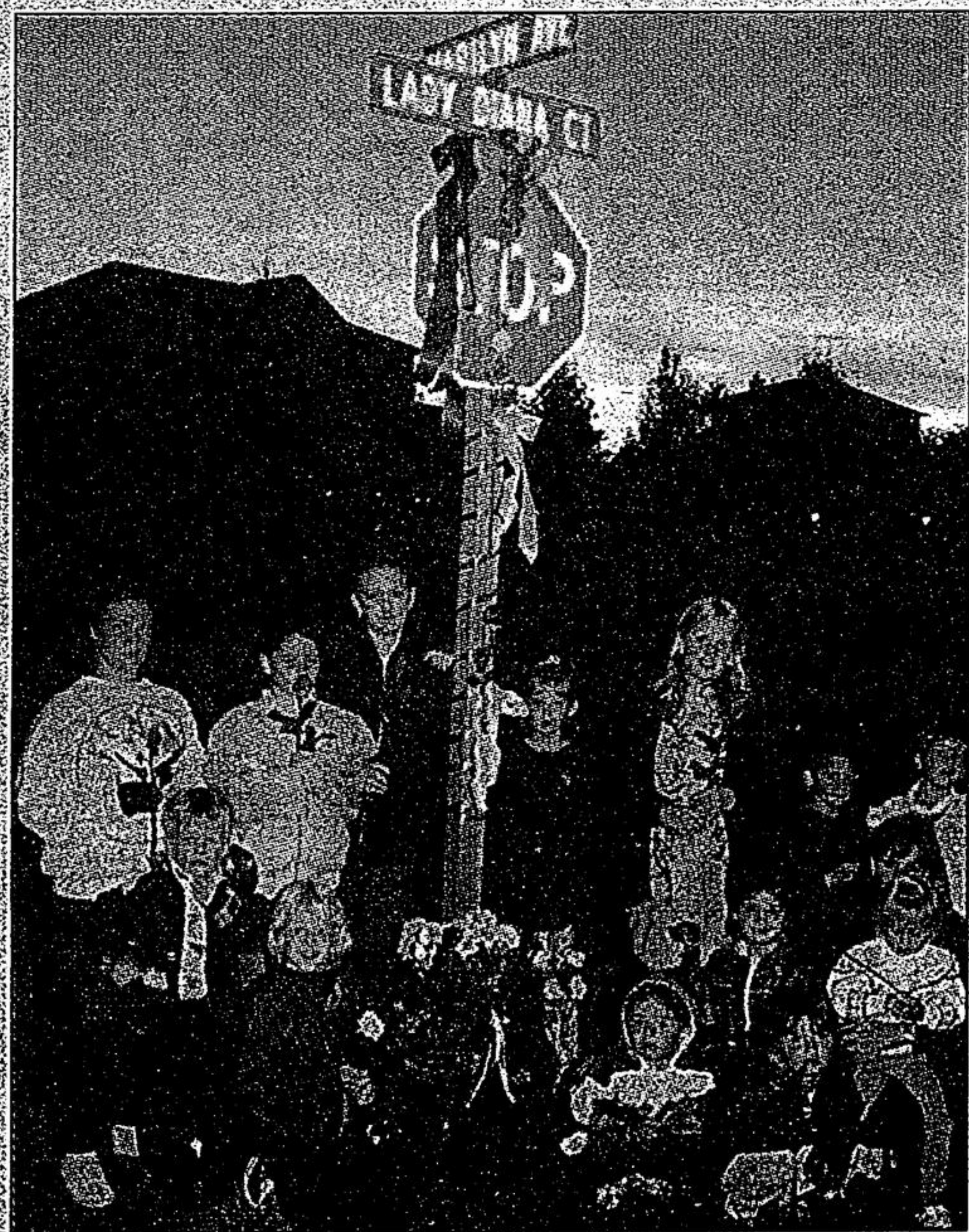
Residents living north of Vandorf are keeping their fingers crossed that public pressure mat-

ters enough that it will result in the depot not being built in their neighbourhood.

The region is "backing off" on its plan to put the depot at the Woodbine site, said Ward 1 Coun-

A condolence book is available at the Anglican Parish of Christ Church at 254 Sunset Blvd. today (Saturday) from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Meanwhile, beginning at 11 a.m., Reverent Robert Shields will officiate at a one-hour memorial service, honouring the Princess of Wales. *The Tribune* is making arrangements to forward this book and other messages of condolences, to the Royal family.

A second condolence book has been set up by the town. The book will be at the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library on Saturday and Sunday. On Monday morning it will be taken to the municipal office where it will be available for two days. On Tuesday evening, the book will be taken to the local council meeting at the Stouffville Missionary Church where it will be signed by Mayor Wayne Emmerson, members of council and members of the public.

Yet another book of condolence is in place today and tomorrow from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at York Hall at York Region Administrative Centre at 17250 Young Street, Newmarket.

The book from York Region will be scanned electronically and sent by E-mail to Buckingham Palace.

Mayor listening to skateboarders

Skateboard facilities in Whitchurch-Stouffville are one giant step closer to being enhanced.

Last week, skateboarders met with Mayor Wayne Emmerson and set the wheels in motion to secure more skateboarding facilities for the town's young people.

Money for skateboarding could come from the Mayor's Youth Fund, said Emmerson.

On Wednesday, skateboarders met with the recreation advisory committee where a skateboard

committee was set up and an agenda was struck, reported committee chairperson Cheryl Johnson.

Plans include a skateboard competition to be held in October.

The town, together with the young people, will look into buying more skateboarding equipment, including half pipes and ramps. As well, the committee will look at finding an appropriate site for skateboarding.

Last year, the town built a half-pipe ramp for skate boarding. While the pipe, located at Memorial Park, is well used, young people have set up another spot at the Stouffville Recreation Complex.
