## Health problem could get people off hook-up hook

A health condition, but only an extreme health condition documented by a doctor, could be grounds for an exemption linked to the hookup to the new communal water system at Musselman's Lake and Ballantrae, town staff is recommending.

Tonight (Tuesday) Whitchurch-Stouffville Council is expected to, once again, debate the issue of delivering water to about 850 households in both hamlets.

Two weeks ago, members of council delayed going to the next step of the process after a Musselman's Lake resident informed council that he shouldn't be included because he has a severe allergy to chlorine.

Peter Dzedzic objects to being forced to pay approximately \$6,000 to get hooked up to the new system.

Dzedzic said exposure to chlorine triggers respiratory difficulty.

Council agreed to delay sending residents a letter stating that the water hookup is not optional.

Now, a staff report recommends that health issues "not be a consideration for an exemption, however, if health issue are ultimately approved as an exemption criterion, it should be an extreme proven health issue as documented by a qualified medical practitioner as it relates to the use of water from a communal water system."

Under the Ministry of Municipal Affairs' mandatory connection bylaw, the notice will tell homeowners they have nine months to get connected to the new communal water system.

The final deadline will be next July.

So far, about 200 homeowners are connected to the system. No one has applied for an exemption, council was told.
