NOTICE OF MEETING

You are invited to attend a Public Meeting to be held by the Planning and Development Committee of the Town of Markham to consider proposed amendments to the Official Plan, Secondary Plans and Zoning By-laws, as they relate to the following four vacant properties owned by the York Region Board of Education:

1. Simonston - northwest corner of Simonston Boulevard and Don Mills Road.
2. Carlton - south side of Carlton Road, west of Village Parkway.
3. Austin - north side of Austin Drive, west of Karma Road.
4. Reesor - south side of Ramona Boulevard, east of Wootten Way North.

BACKGROUND

In 1996, the York Region Board of Education announced that the four properties were surplus to its needs. Following discussions between the School Board and the Town of Markham, agreement was reached that the sites would not be sold, but instead would be conveyed to the Town in exchange for future school sites in the Town's Urban Expansion Area. The School Board and the Town also agreed that the sites would be used only for schools, recreational and other community and related facilities.

PROPOSAL

The four sites are currently designated and zoned to permit a variety of land uses including residential development on the Carlton and Reesor properties. In accordance with the agreement between the School Board and the Town, it is proposed that the sites be redesignated and rezoned to restrict their use to schools, recreational and other community and related facilities.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT

The purpose and effect of the proposed amendments are to restrict the use of the four sites to schools, recreational and other community and related purposes.

NOTE REGARDING OFFICIAL PLAN AND ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENTS

If you wish to be notified of the adoption of the proposed Official Plan and Secondary Plan amendments, you must make a written request to the Clerk of the Town of Markham at the address noted above.

If a person or public body that files a notice of appeal of a decision of the Town of Markham in respect of the proposed Official Plan and Secondary Plan amendments, or an appeal of a decision of the Town of Markham in respect of the proposed zoning by-law amendments, does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Markham before they are adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.
