

Latcham Gallery has busy schedule slated for fall season

Stouffville's Latcham Gallery is going to be one busy place this fall. The gallery has just announced a programming

schedule that includes everything from videos to adult art appreciation classes. "For a lot of families fall is

really the first season of the year. The holidays are over, kids are back at school and everyone gets resettled," explained the

gallery's director/curator Christopher Jackson. "So it's a good time for us to increase our programming after a summer hiatus."

For younger art aficionados, popular art teacher Judy Bear Campbell will be holding art classes at the gallery. The series of two-hour classes for seven to 12-year-olds will run on Saturday mornings between 10 a.m. and noon, from Oct. 18 to Nov. 8. The fee for the classes is \$50 for gallery members and \$60 for non-members and includes materials.

"Judy Bear Campbell has built up quite a following in the area as an art teacher, and we're very pleased she has agreed to offer these classes," Jackson said. "In fact, she is so popular we have to limit the registration or we would be swamped."

In addition to the children's classes, Jackson himself will present a series of adult art appreciation slides, lectures and discussions ranging from a look at abstract art for confirmed "unbelievers" to a discussion modern craft as a metaphor within our society.

"This series is aimed at adults specifically. In fact, several of the lectures in this program are drawn from lectures I have given or will be giving for education programs at other galleries or for university courses. They aren't tied to

our exhibitions like artists' talks generally are, and the discussion can be more wide ranging."

The five-lecture series runs consecutive Tuesdays, Oct. 7 through Nov. 4 between 7:30 and 9 p.m. at the gallery. The fee is \$65 for non-members and \$50 for gallery members.

The gallery will also be offering a series of free screenings of National Film Board and National Gallery of Canada videos on Canadian art.

"We'll be screening these one Saturday a month throughout the fall. At least two of the videos, one on Canadian printmaker David Blackwood and another on renowned Canadian painter Alex Colville, were nominated for Academy Awards," the director/curator pointed out.

Besides those, we'll be showing a video on contemporary Canadian crafters and a humorous, but sympathetic look at East Coast folk artists entitled Folk Art Found Us. We hope to extend the video series throughout the year."

The screenings will take place in the gallery between 1:15 and 3 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 18, Dec. 10, and Jan. 21.

This notice is provided to candidates who are seeking election in the forthcoming Municipal Elections which will be held on November 10, 1997. Nomination Forms will be accepted for the following list of elected offices:

- Mayor** one (1) member to be elected by all of the electors in the Town of Markham.
- Regional Councillor** four (4) members to be elected by all of the electors in the Town of Markham
- Ward Councillors** eight (8) members to be elected, one each per Ward (Wards 1 to 8, inclusive) in the Town of Markham.
- Members of the Markham Hydro-Electric Commission** four (4) members to be elected by all of the electors in the Town of Markham
- Members for the English Language Public District School Board #16** (York Region Board of Education) four (4) members to be elected, one each per Area (Areas 1 to 4, inclusive) to represent the Town of Markham.
- Members for the English Language Separate District School Board #42** (York Region Roman Catholic Separate School Board) two (2) members to be elected, one each per Area to represent the Town of Markham
- Member for the French Language Public District School Board #58** one (1) member to represent North York, Scarborough, and York Region (excluding the municipalities of East Gwillimbury, Georgina and Newmarket).

Note: Please telephone the Clerk's Department of the Town of Markham regarding nominations for this office.

- Member for the French Language Separate District School Board #64** one (1) member to represent York Region.

The term of office for these positions is 3 years, starting December 1, 1997 and ending November 30, 2000.

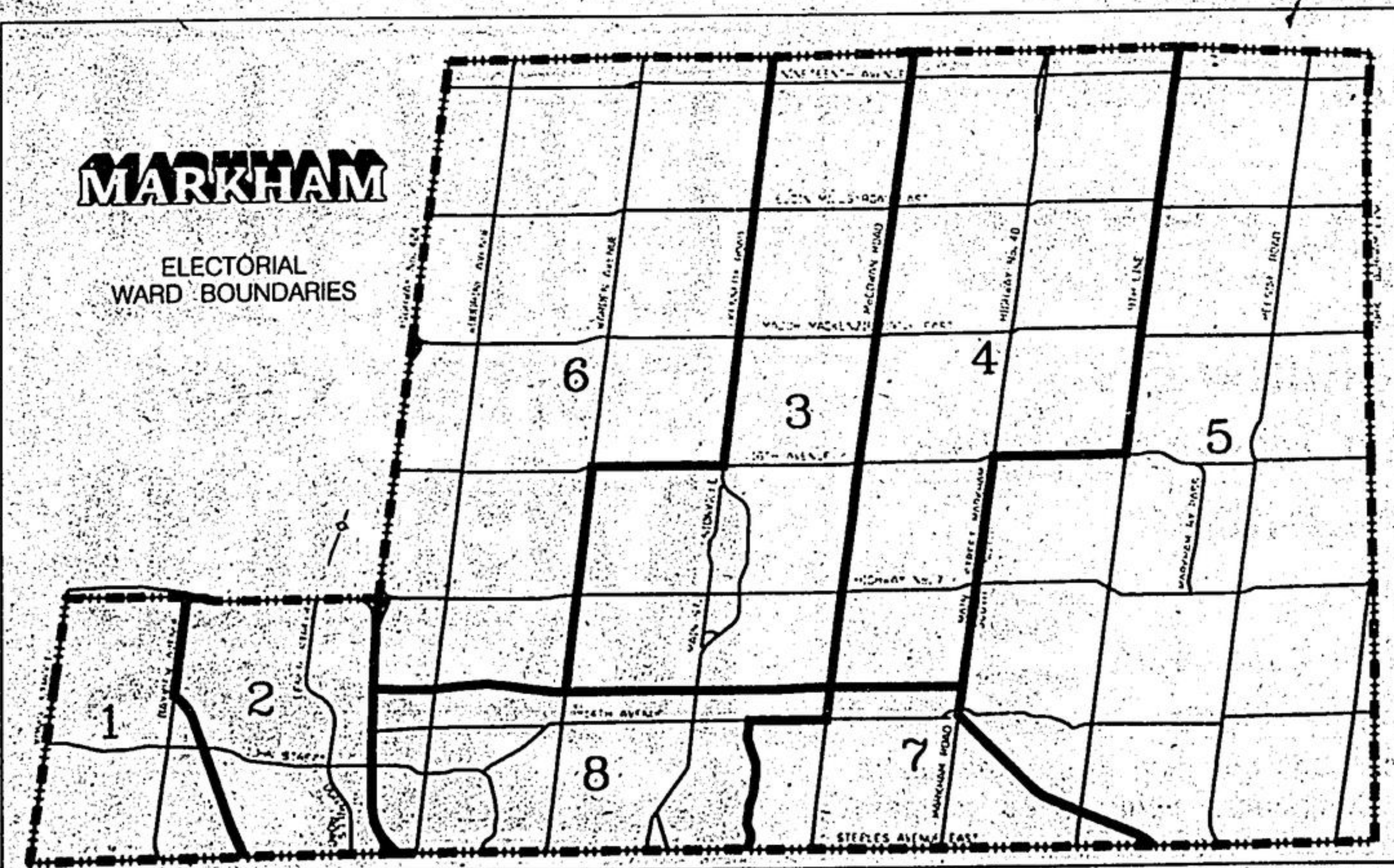
All candidates must be eligible to be qualified electors in order to be nominated. Information on qualifications may be obtained from the Town Clerk's Office.

Each Nomination Form, which is also available in the Town Clerk's Office, must be accompanied by a deposit, either a certified cheque (payable to the Town of Markham) or cash in the amount of \$100.

Anyone who wishes to become a candidate must file their Nomination Form **IN PERSON** at the Town Clerk's Office, Town of Markham, 101 Town Centre Blvd. (Highway #7 and Warden Ave.) during normal office hours Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The Last Date to file a Nomination Form is Friday, October 10, 1997, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

IF YOUR NAME IS NOT ON THE LIST, WHAT DO YOU DO?

In order to be on the Voters' List you must be qualified to be an elector in the Town of Markham.

QUALIFICATIONS OF AN ELECTOR:

- You must be 18 years of age on or before Election Day, November 10, 1997.
 - You must be a Canadian Citizen.
 - You must be a resident of the Town of Markham,
- OR
- If you are not a resident of the Town, you must be an owner or tenant of land, or the spouse of an owner or tenant of land in the Town of Markham.

If you qualify and your name has been omitted from the Voters' List, or the information is incorrectly shown, please contact the Town of Markham Clerk's Department, telephone number 477-7000, ext. 571 or 309 and the appropriate application form will be mailed to you.
