

# Local artist gives new meaning to term 'house painter'

Many people think of their home as an extension of themselves, a place which not only provides shelter, but reflects their personality.

Stouffville resident Christine Parsons Wood is a qualified architect who paints custom watercolours of homes, pets or favourite scenes for her clients and who knows first hand how much a house can mean to its owners.

"I had done some freelance work after I graduated and then I started to do watercolours about 10 years ago," said Wood. "Artistic ability runs in my family – my parents, brother and sister are all creative."

One fall, when she was living in Burlington, her work was featured in The Hamilton Spectator.

"It was a couple of months before Christmas and I got a lot of exposure and response through that," she recalled. "People particularly liked the fact that this was a unique gift."

Wood and her family moved to the Stouffville area five years ago and she is now getting a number of commissions through referrals from other clients.

As a shy individual, her biggest challenge is to promote what she does. "I didn't know how to market it, but I eventually came up with a way."

She would paint a house which appealed to her, make a photocopy of her work, tie it with a ribbon and drop it into the owner's mailbox. "I'd write a note telling them to phone me if they were interested (in buying). I don't want people to feel any obligation. I think they

should have time to think through their decision without pressure."

In the two years since she started using this approach, "I have been able to sell 80 per cent of my paintings. People see them and fall in love with them."

Wood is happy to work from photographs supplied by the homeowner, even if the quality is not perfect.

"When they bring the photo, we decide on size and a season, and when I'm finished and show it to them, if they want to make any minor changes I am willing to do that, because I want them to be totally satisfied."

Although not a winter person, she now leans towards winter as the most effective

setting for the homes she paints.

"The white around the house acts like a frame."

One client ordered four paintings of the family home for his children, each depicting a different season, "and the children ended

up fighting over the winter scene."

Although homes make up most of her commission work, she is also an accomplished landscape artist, and is happy to show clients her watercolours.
