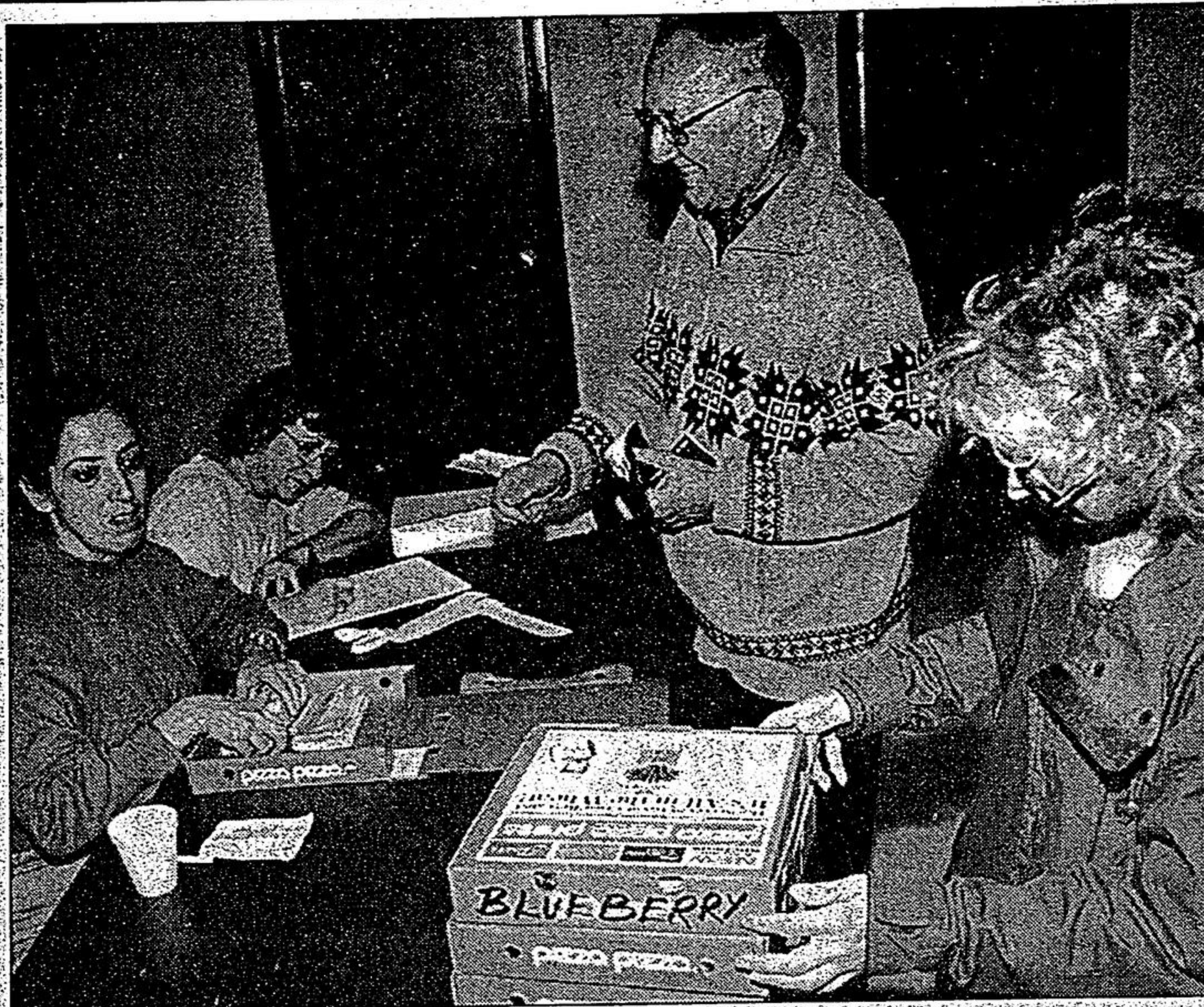

HIV and AIDS information available

Many Canadians still think HIV/AIDS can't happen to them. However, the fact that the rate of new infections continues to increase means it is happening to someone and York Region residents are not immune.

Despite recent advances in the treatment of AIDS, the rate of new infections continues to climb.

An estimated 50,000 Canadians are currently living with HIV, with about 5,000 more Canadians becoming infected each year. The new infection rate is highest among youth, injection drug users, women, aboriginal peoples and young gay men. Half of all new infections occur in people under age 25.

Since 1981, cases of HIV/AIDS have been reported in York Region.

HIV is spread mainly by unprotected sexual intercourse and sharing of needles for injection drug use.

HIV can also be transmitted from an infected mother to her baby through pregnancy and breastfeeding.

Unlike many other diseases, we know how HIV is spread and what needs to be done to prevent it.

York Region Health Services AIDS Program staff urge sexually active people and anyone who shares needles for injecting drugs to learn all they can about preventing HIV/AIDS.

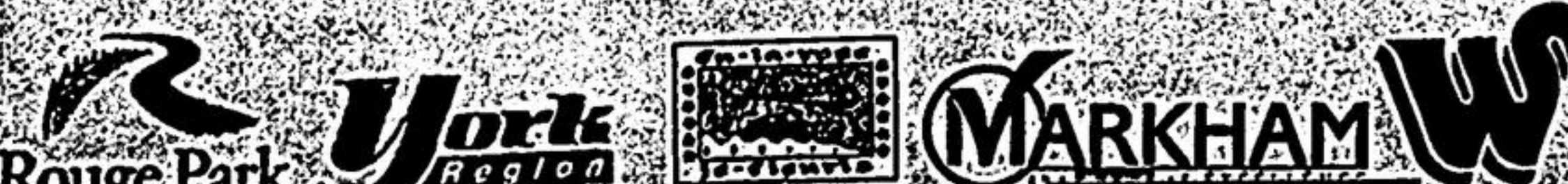
The Rouge Park North Study Area includes the major tributaries of the Rouge River from Steeles Avenue to the Oak Ridges Moraine.
