

Stouffville clinic aims for 160 blood donations

Stouffville residents are being asked to help boost the blood supply in central Ontario by attending a local clinic on Oct. 10 from 2 to 8 p.m.

Local blood donors and potential donors can visit the Stouffville Legion Hall on the Ninth Line.

The local clinic's goal is 160 blood donations.

Leslie Geddes, spokesperson for the Canadian Red Cross, pointed out that donations are "especially important" leading up to the Thanksgiving weekend.

Today, hospital blood stock orders of several blood groups are being reduced to help maintain inventory for emergencies, said Geddes.

"All blood types are needed, especially Group O which is extremely low," Geddes added.

Now that fall is here, many central Ontario hospi-

tals have returned to full surgical schedules.

Recently, blood was also vital to the lives of many patients including seven people with internal bleeding, two people with ruptured aneurysms, a burn patient, a motor vehicles accident and two new mothers.

years. The people were always so good to me and I can honestly say, I did all I could to serve them."

She passes on this advice to the municipal candidates: "The true perk of sitting on council is that you potentially can make a difference. The possibility exists to implement necessary change to help people and to encourage the quality of life in the community that we proudly call home."

Bradley does, however, caution the political hopefuls. "To achieve benefits for our community, we need a council that truly reflects the voice of the people." While the new council needs to pay close attention to such areas as finance and planning, the need


for a more open government is "by far" the most important, said Bradley. "The needs for openness applies to the electorate as well as the general public. Access to information must be generous. Information is a powerful tool for a member of council. Besides, it enables the residents to demand accountability and to question elected representatives."

What this town's financial picture is, is a question Bradley would like answered. "The people pay the shot. They deserve to know exactly what their town is worth. What do we have in reserves? If, through provincial amalgamation, Whitchurch-Stouffville is swallowed up, the people should know where they stand."
