Averill is looking to add a few dollars to the coffers of the Stouffville mite selects by selling raffle tickets on a bulletin board filled with pucks from each National Hockey League team.

The board is framed in with recycled hockey sticks, with the sticks also forming the stand upon which the whole thing sits.

The bulletin board is a sample of the work being done by Averill through his home business, Stouffville Stick Works.

He also offers bulletin boards with the customer's choice of NHL team pucks on the four corners, leaving space for items to be pinned on the corkboard.

There are pegs on the bottom of the board for hanging hats or collective sweaters on hangers.

Tickets for the draw prize bulletin board are \$2 each, or three for \$5. They will be available at Spirit of Stouffville Thursday night games.

Averill started his business last year. He hopes to some day turn the operation into a full-time business.

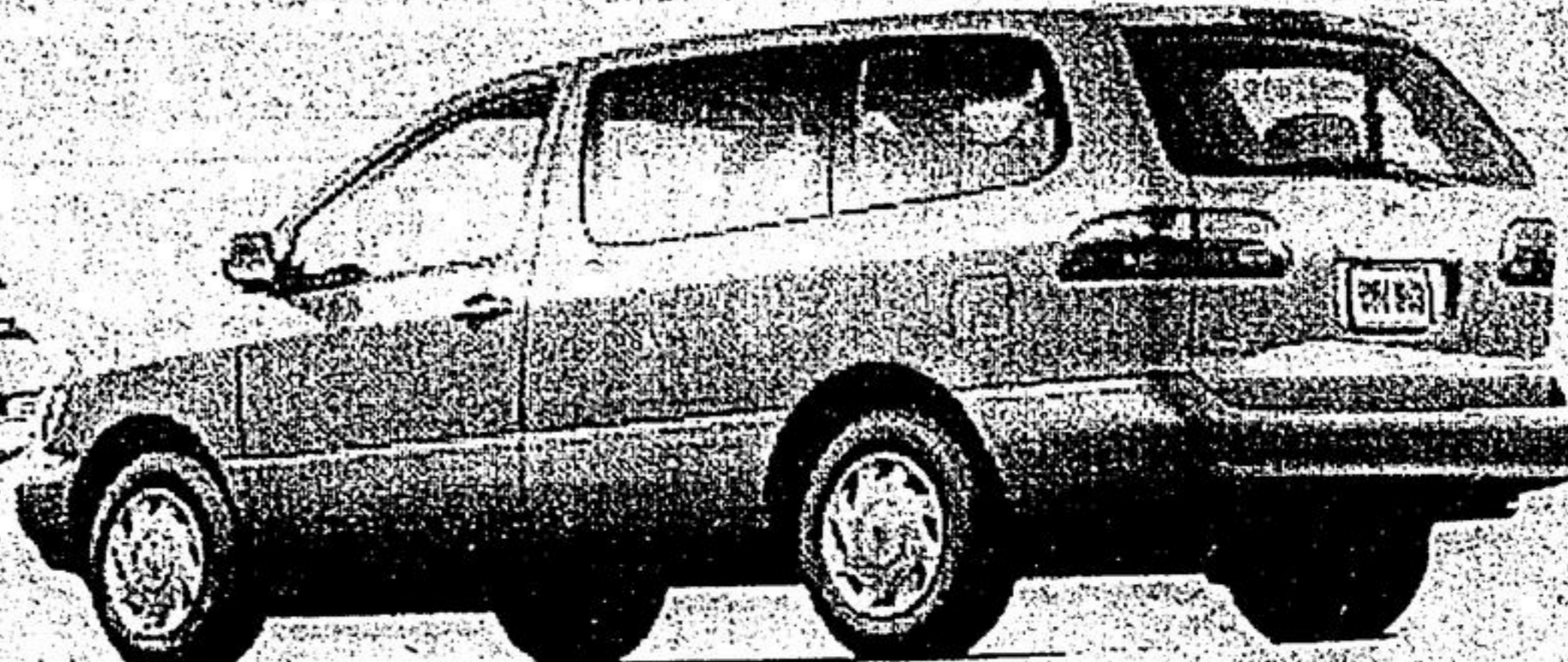
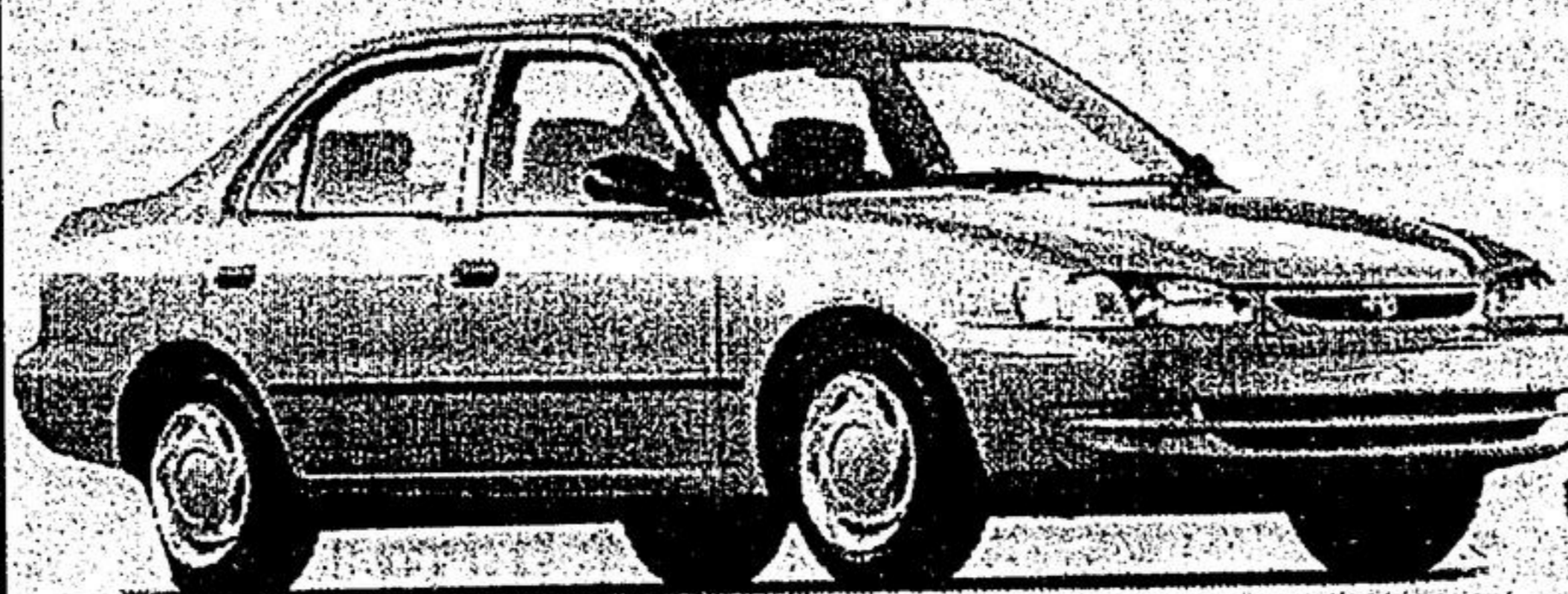
