

Juvenile Clippers win two, remain undefeated

Andrew Hutchison continues to play a key role in the success of the juvenile Clippers.

The team's lone Stouffville minor hockey product had a goal and two assists in a 9-0 Clippers league win over East Gwillimbury last Monday, then netted a pair of markers and added an assist in Saturday night's home ice 6-4 exhibition triumph over the MTHL "AAA" Leaside Kings.

The Juveniles have won all 13 league matches this season, while also taking all three exhibition contents played.

The Clippers fell behind 4-0 in the first period, but bounced back to trail by only 5-3 at the end of the second. They added another pair in the third, but the visitors clinched it with a trio of their own.

The teams will play a return match in Aurora at the end of the month.

Fontanna and Brown each netted a pair for the Clippers. Jones also scored, with assists going to Sullivan (3), Heyworth (2), Williams, Jeremy Morris, Brown, Matt Prentice and Jones.




