

Major novices on a roll

A short staffed Stouffville IDA major novice Clippers team picked up five of six points in a recent three-game road trip, while the novice selects showed great heart in earning a tie in their first six matches of the season.

The IDA outfit, reduced to just nine skaters due to illness, got a goal from Luke Mabley on a penalty shot, and a second marker from Warren Tayles in a 2-0 win over the Markham Waxers.

Mabley and Eric Gainsbrook assisted on Tayles' tally.

Chris Schell, Chris Stewart and Taylor Campbell scored to enable the Clippers to tie Whitby 3-3 in their next outing. Tayles had two assists and Gainsbrook one.

The Clippers closed out the road swing with a 4-1 win over Innisfil.

Mabley netted the hat trick, and Tayles' one assist went to Campbell (two). Brandon Jupp, Luke Harrison

and Gainsbrook. Jake Baldson was solid in net.

The novice selects, co-sponsored by Fairgate Homes, Metro Waste Paper Recovery Inc. and Stewart's Truck Wrecking Ltd., dropped their first three games to Pickering 6-0, East Gwillimbury 2-1, and Bradford 2-0 before earning a 3-3 tie with Uxbridge.

Justin Lawrence scored Stouffville's lone marker in their loss to East Gwillimbury. Jeremy Schell and Wesley Davis earned assists.

Ben Sampson netted a pair in the tie with Uxbridge and Lawrence, one. Salvo Andolina, Davis and Schell earned assists.

The selects then got two goals from Sampson and singles from Lawrence, Schell and Michael Mettauro in a 10-5 loss to Keswick. The selects rounded out play with losses to Richmond Hill 3-0 and Newmarket major novices 8-1.

Spartans cage win and loss in opener

A quartet of Stouffville District Secondary School (SDSS) teams hit the court Wednesday as the York Region Athletic Association (YRAA) boys' basketball and girls' volleyball seasons got under way.

The Spartans squads achieved mixed results.

The short staffed junior boys' Spartans basketball team managed a gutsy 68-62 home court win over the Milliken Mills H.S. Knights.

The Spartans used a determined defensive approach to back up the offensive efforts of Jim Apolonatos and Mark Burkholder, who picked up 17 and 14 points respectively. B.J. James had 11 points, with Cory Turchan hitting for 11.

The midget Spartans dropped a 79-50 decision to a more experi-

enced Knights crew in the other half of the hoops twin bill.

Ben Bellissimo sunk 18 points for the Spartans, who went with a full roster of 22 players, most rookies, for the game. Shane Timms had a solid game at guard with seven points, while Curtis Cromwell showed outstanding hustle. Jason Davis had six points, Jon Ferguson four.

Meanwhile in Markham, the Spartans senior girls' volleyball team was sweeping to victory over Brother Andre C.H.S. and Markham D.H.S. in their season opener.

The midget SDSS crew swept their Brother Andre opponents two straight, but were in turn swept by Markham.

The midget Spartans boys' basketball team prepared for the new season with a 71-64 exhibition game victory over Uxbridge S.S.

Tim Lowrie, Timms and Bellissimo each picked up 14 points, while Ferguson added 10.

The midgets are once again being coached by Andy Cherkas, who will share the load with the school's former senior basketball coach Jim Fletcher.

Returning to coach at the midget level for the first time in 11 years, Fletcher said he and Cherkas are out to mould their young team for the future.

"We're coming, we're building to take a run at the YRAA AA title in three or four years (as a senior team)," said Fletcher.

Grover Bradford has returned to coach the junior hoops squad, with assistance from Carey Spiece.

The SDSS teachers will face off against the school's OAC students hockey team on Monday at 2:30 p.m. at the Rec Centre.

Scoring for the Clippers in the three games were Spang and Steckley (one goal, one assist each), Wonch, and Nesbitt with a breakaway game winner against Niagara Falls. Lyons, Robinson, and Wild assisted. Adam Davis was rock solid in goal for two periods. The Clippers are at home to Sutton this Sunday (Dec. 14) at 5:10 p.m.


MINOR ATOM SELECTS EARN WIN
