The Birkett-Hassard Insurance minor novice Clippers won a pair and tied one in four pre-Christmas games.

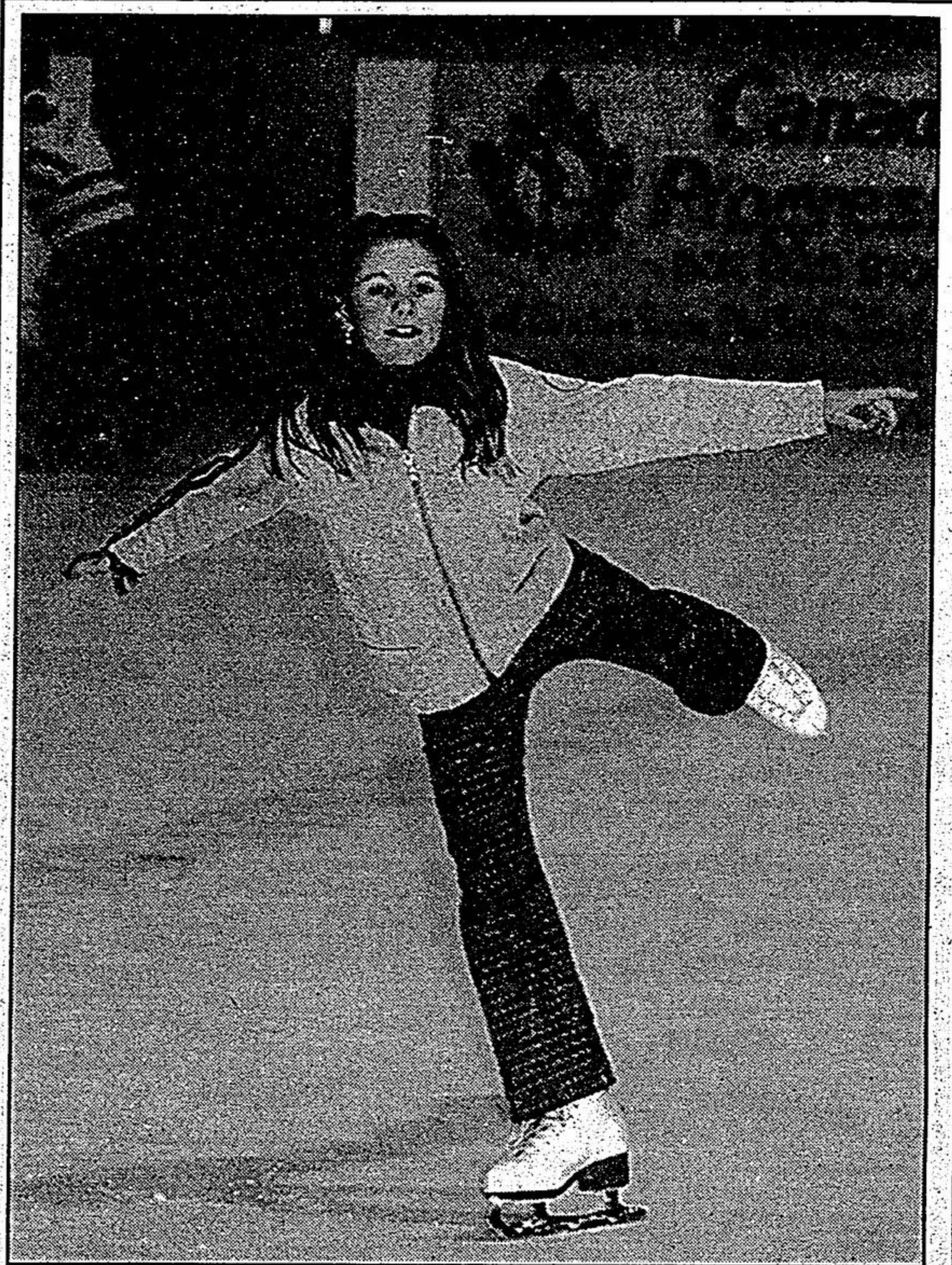

Stingrays spiked in pursuit of bronze medal

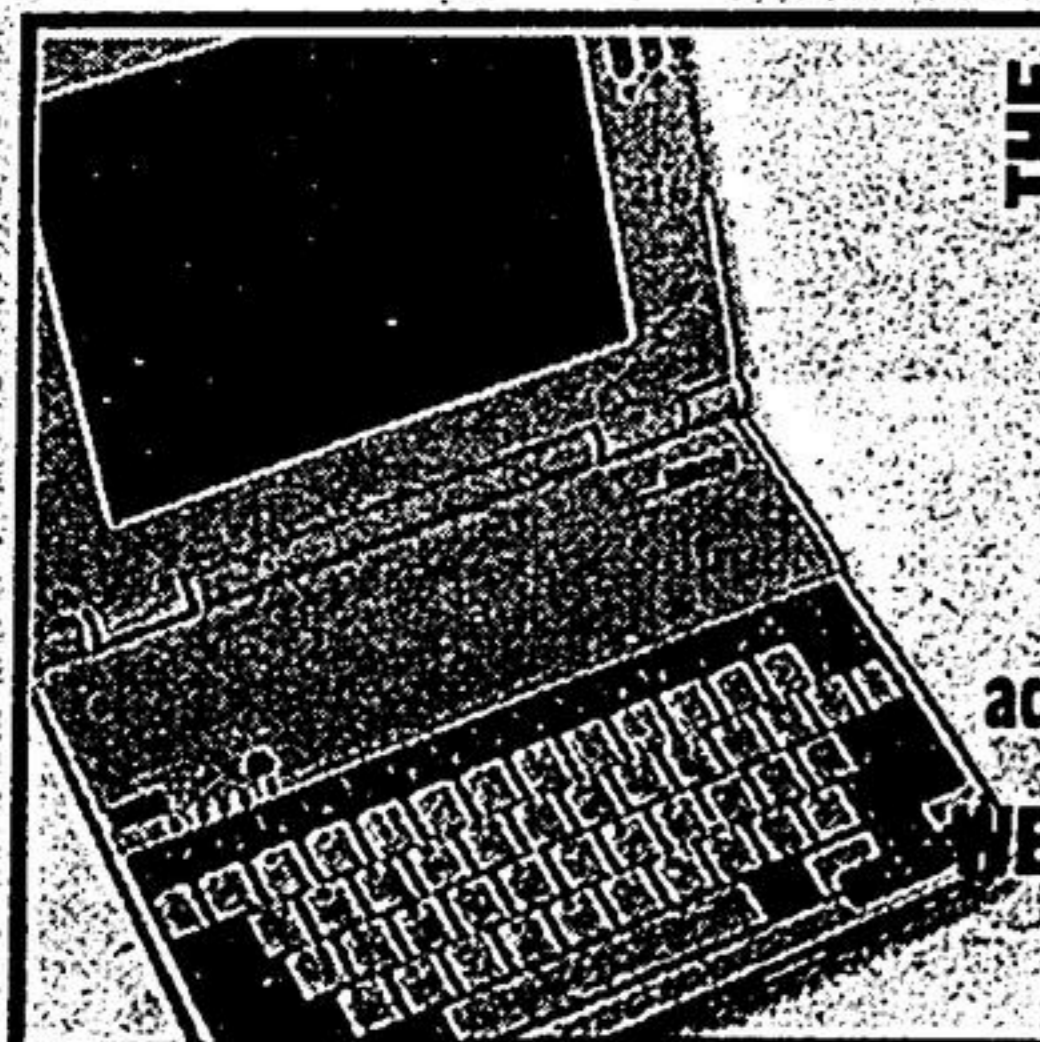
The Stingrays bantam girls' volleyball team went as far as the bronze medal game at the recent McGregor Cup Volleyball Tournament in Unionville.
