The chairman of the Whitchurch-Stouffville library board, Monica van Maris, resigned, citing philosophical differences between herself and other board members.

Stouffville resident David M. Kissen was found guilty of 10 fraud charges and one impersonation charge. Kissen often passed himself off as a lawyer. Kissen's sentencing took place on May 7.

The Music Mania troupe presented their annual variety show, *Mystery Aboard The Heritage Express*, at the Stouffville District Secondary School.
