NOVEMBER

• Tonino Iaffrate pleaded guilty to criminal negligence causing death in connection with the death of Darlene O'Blenes.

• On Nov. 10, school was officially back in session, ending a two-week illegal strike over Bill 160. As a result of the strike, school graduation ceremonies were canceled and rescheduled for later dates.

• Also on Nov. 10 Wayne Emmerson was re-elected mayor, despite facing a strong challenge from mayoralty contender Mike Watson, attracting 3,490 votes compared to Watson's 2,599.

Virginia Hackson won the race for trustee for the Whitchurch-Stouffville and East Gwillimbury public school board. Steve Pilakes won the race for Ward 1. Mark Carroll won a narrow victory for Ward 2. Peter Dobrich took Ward 3 in a photo finish. Judy Scala held onto her seat in Ward 5 and Sue Sherban won the race for Ward 6. Cliff Dunkeld was acclaimed in Ward 4 back in October.

• On Nov. 19 Gemini Store Fixtures Ltd. purchased the building that Erie Manufacturing Company was vacating. The manufacturing business would relocate from Scarborough and bring with it 20 jobs.

• Government officials, including Oak Ridges MP Bryon Wilfert, announced that a \$550,000 grant was on its way to fix water pipes running from the Ninth Line to the Millard Street area. Whitchurch-Stouffville was also one step closer to getting a

new well, valued at \$427,000, slated for Main Street East, near the townline.

DECEMBER

• Council voted to allow liquor and beer stores to be open Sundays at a late meeting on Dec. 1.

• The Kinsmen Club's annual Santa Claus Parade took place on Dec. 6 with more than 25 floats in tow.

• Markham Regional Councillor Bill Fisch became York Region's new chairperson on Dec. 11.

• On Dec. 12, Ontario Premier Mike Harris' "revenue neutral" promise translated into a \$118,000 shortfall in provincial transfer money for Whitchurch-Stouffville.

• The United Way of York Region went beyond its own expectations and raised \$3.5 million for its local agencies.

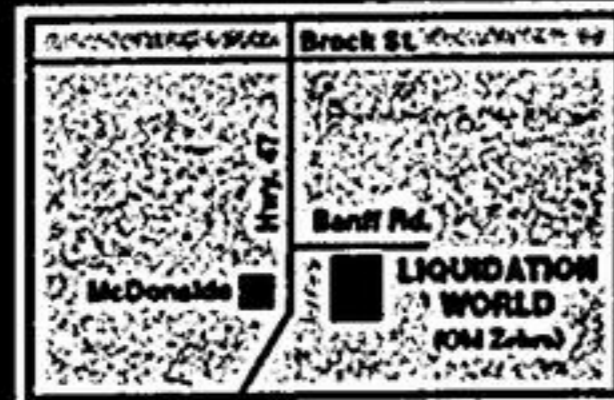
