Moving day for Gemini

■ *Company moving into Erie Manufacturing site still looking to hire employees*

A Stouffville businessman is learning how to juggle. A few days ago, following an exciting and, at times, hectic move from Scarborough to Ballantrae, production got underway at Gemini Store Fixtures Ltd. Moving day was, indeed, a challenge, said business co-owner Jeff Usling. So much to do and so little time, he said. After buying the building and five acres of property that once housed Erie Manufacturing, Usling put the wheels in motion to move his company, stock and barrel. With it came \$750,000 worth of wood working machinery, 30 employees and the hopes of filling job vacancies for much-needed cabinet makers. "I've hired four. Yet, I need five more," said Usling. Gemini manufactures such products as cash counters and display cabinets. Putting the word out for cabinet makers is one of many chores.
