FALLS PREVENTION CLINIC

Falls are the sixth leading cause of death among seniors in Canada and account for twice as many fatalities as car accidents among those aged 75 and up. Women in this group are especially at risk from falls, the majority of which occur in the home. Most falls result from underlying physical illness, reactions to medication, poor muscle strength or balance and environmental hazards. Prevention is a major priority and public health nurses will conduct a falls clinic which will be held Jan. 28 at Parkview Village, 12184 Ninth Line, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. For more information, or to register for the clinic, call Joanne Maika White at 640-1940.
