Local Lion Mike Morrison explained that the

plants are on their way to the Silver Jubilee Club, Parkview Village, Parkview Home, Green Gables Manor, Buckingham Manor, seniors living in apartments on Elm Street, Winlane Avenue and Rupert Avenue.

"The plants are purchased through

the Canadian National Institute for the Blind as part of the focus on crocus annual sale.

"It represents the Stouffville Lions' continued attempt to contribute money earned throughout the

year towards sight projects," said Morrison.

The International Lions Club is known world-wide for its donations to such programs as Seeing Eye Dogs and Sight First.
