Gallery still lives

Latham Gallery took one step forward and one step back Tuesday night.

While Whitchurch-Stouffville Council and a Latham Gallery committee put the wheels in motion to re-open the 19-year-old facility, the local library board put a plan in place which means the gallery has to find a new home.

Somewhere, somehow, there will be a Latham Gallery, said art supporter Linda Giles.

The space used by Latham Gallery is needed for other library programs, said library board chairman Jan Williams.

Gallery space is needed to section off children programs to prevent the little ones "from running through the library" disturbing others, said

Williams. A major library expansion is, however, in the works. The expansion, valued at about \$2 million, is expected to be carried out very soon.

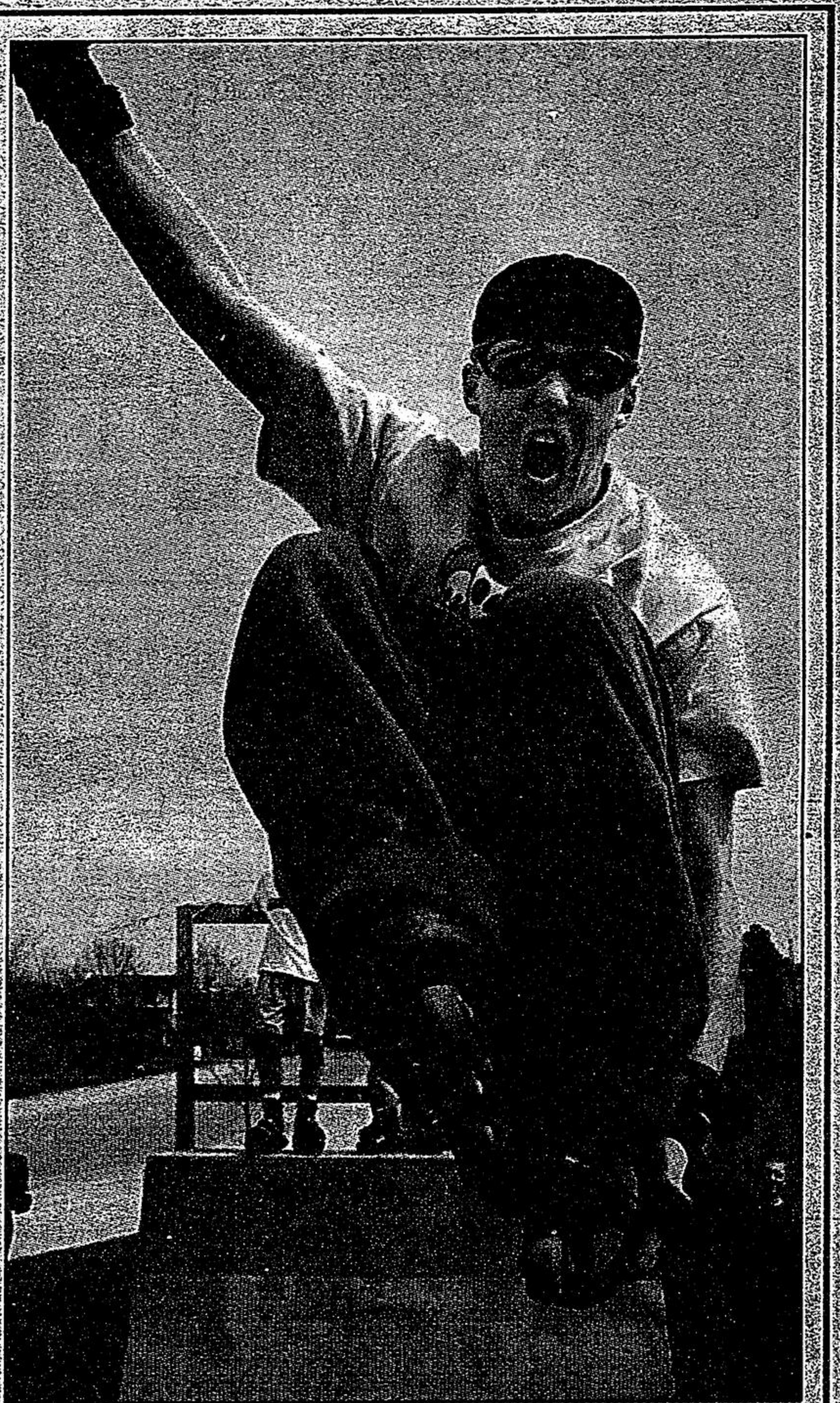
The ground-breaking for the library expansion could take place in a year, said Ward 5 Councillor and library board member Judy Scala. "We could be in a position to break ground a year from now," said Scala.

Once the library is expanded, Latham Gallery could move back into its space and operate as an independent, said Scala.

In the meantime, the (Latham) space can be put to good use, said Williams.

Library staff presented a five-page report listing suggested alternative uses for Latham Gallery. It includes all pre-school programs, annual book sale, reading programs, a math skill
