

No fastball team at SDSS

There will be one less championship banner unfurled at the annual Stouffville District Secondary School (SDSS) Athletic Banquet this June.

Due to a lack of schools choosing to take part in the program, the SDSS Spartans boys' fastpitch team won't get the chance to make it five York Region Athletic Association (YRAA) titles in a row.

SDSS boys phys ed head Dave Connell said the SDSS school was one of only three teams to register this year, causing officials to scrap the program.

Connell said there were three reasons behind the drop in interest.

"The first is that we've dominated fastpitch the past decade or so," stated Connell.

"The second is that softball is becoming so popular, and the third is politics."

The Spartans, under coaches Bill McKnight and Tami Waters, swept to the York crown the past four seasons, and were undefeated in three years. The team won six regional titles over the past 10 years, going as

far as the finals on three other occasions.

Last June, McKnight announced his intention to step down as SDSS boys' fastpitch coach after 10 years.

TRACKSTERS TUNE UP
Stouffville District Secondary School (SDSS) athletes were off and running at the recent York Region Athletic Association (YRAA) Indoor Track and Field Championships at York University.

Luke Williams covered the 400-metre distance in a time of 57.4 seconds to take the third-place ribbon in the junior boys' category. He also had a sixth-place finish in the junior boys' 800m race.

Julianne Lowrie was fourth in both the senior girls' 800m and 1500m. Aaron Altman's last second sprint put him into sixth place in the senior boys' 60m dash. Altman, who qualified for the final with a time of 7.36 in his heat, ran the final in 7.45 seconds.

Tracey Hoher, running in her first race ever at the York facility, finished strong to place

seventh in the midget girls' 400m with a time of 70.51 seconds.

Grade 9 student Travis McMaster pushed it to the limit to place ninth out of 49 competitors in his first ever midget boys' long jump.

DARTS LEAGUE CHAMPIONS DECIDED

The nucleus of the Fullerton's crew, which also won the regular season championship, has been together three years. It was their first title.

The local darts league includes 14 teams and has been in operation four years. Games are played weeknights throughout the fall and winter season.
