GO riders get faster service

The local GO train will start GO-ing to Toronto a bit faster next month. Starting June 29, commuters on the Stouffville line can sleep in a little more. The late morning train to Union Station will leave the Stouffville platform at 7:23, not 7:12 a.m. It will reach Markham Station at 7:37 instead of 7:26, and Unionville Station at 7:46 instead of 7:35. Yet the late train will reach its destination at 8:16, only five minutes later than it does now, because the Stouffville line trains will no longer stop at Scarborough or Danforth, two stations on their route to the city. GO Transit said both afternoon return trains will leave Union at the current times, but should complete their run into

York Region six minutes faster. The first train should pull into Stouffville Station at 5:35 p.m., not 5:41. Making the Stouffville service "express" from Agincourt to Union will benefit 2,400 riders a day and inconvenience only eight, Edmund Shea, GO spokesperson, said yesterday. The change is one of several aimed at making more seats available for commuters on GO's trains without spending a large sum, said Shea. Unfortunately, they also appear to be making Toronto mayor Mel Lastman hopping mad. Already unsatisfied with the city's share of GO costs, Lastman denounced the idea of trains from Stouffville or elsewhere zooming past Toronto commuters this week. But Eldred King, chair of GO's board

Parents seek more after-school programs

Public school parents want extra-curricular activities at their schools, but teachers can't be forced to provide them. Many teachers put in long hours coaching or supervising after school, but during the last school year, some local elementary schools offered less activities than others. And parents, naturally, were quick to notice. A district public board joint task force with elementary teachers
