

Communities linked through trail

Stouffville and Uxbridge will be part of a Trans-Canada Trail winding from sea to sea, the mayors and regional chairs of the Greater Toronto Area agreed last week.

The mayors showed support for the trail, which will link existing trails and encourage communities to fill in the gaps. The Southcentral section of the trail will go to Uxbridge

from Lindsay, then head south to and along the Oak Ridges Moraine to Stouffville and the Rouge Valley," according to the Ontario Trails Council.

"The enthusiasm is growing," David Turner, chair of a volunteer committee promoting the trail in Ontario. "There have been some lines drawn on maps but the details have to be worked out."

The trail is supposed to share at least two of its five "core uses" — foot traffic, cycling, horseback riding, cross-country skiing and snowmobiling — during any given season.

Building it will be a great challenge, Turner said.

Prime Minister Jean Chretien has declared the trail, which would stretch east from the Atlantic to the Pacific and north to the Beaufort Sea, is a national goal for the millennium, said Turner.

The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Works Department will be conducting a watermain flushing program throughout the Community of Stouffville, commencing Monday June 1st, 1998 through to Friday June 5th, 1998. This work will be conducted between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

COMMUNITIES OF BALLANTRAE & MUSSELMAN LAKE

The Public Works Department advises that it is conducting routine Bi-weekly flushing operations of the Ballantrae/Musselman Lake municipal water distribution system.

The next flushing of the system is scheduled to resume on Monday June 1st, 1998 and will be conducted between the hours of 9:00 a.m. & 3:30 p.m., and will be repeated every two (2) weeks until further notice. It is estimated that it will take three (3) days to complete the activity.

This flushing is necessary to simulate normal operation of the system.

During the flushing operation discoloration of the water may occur and because of this we ask for your assistance by restricting the use of water to a minimum while the work is being conducted. Should discoloration of the water occur after the work has been completed let water run until it clears.
