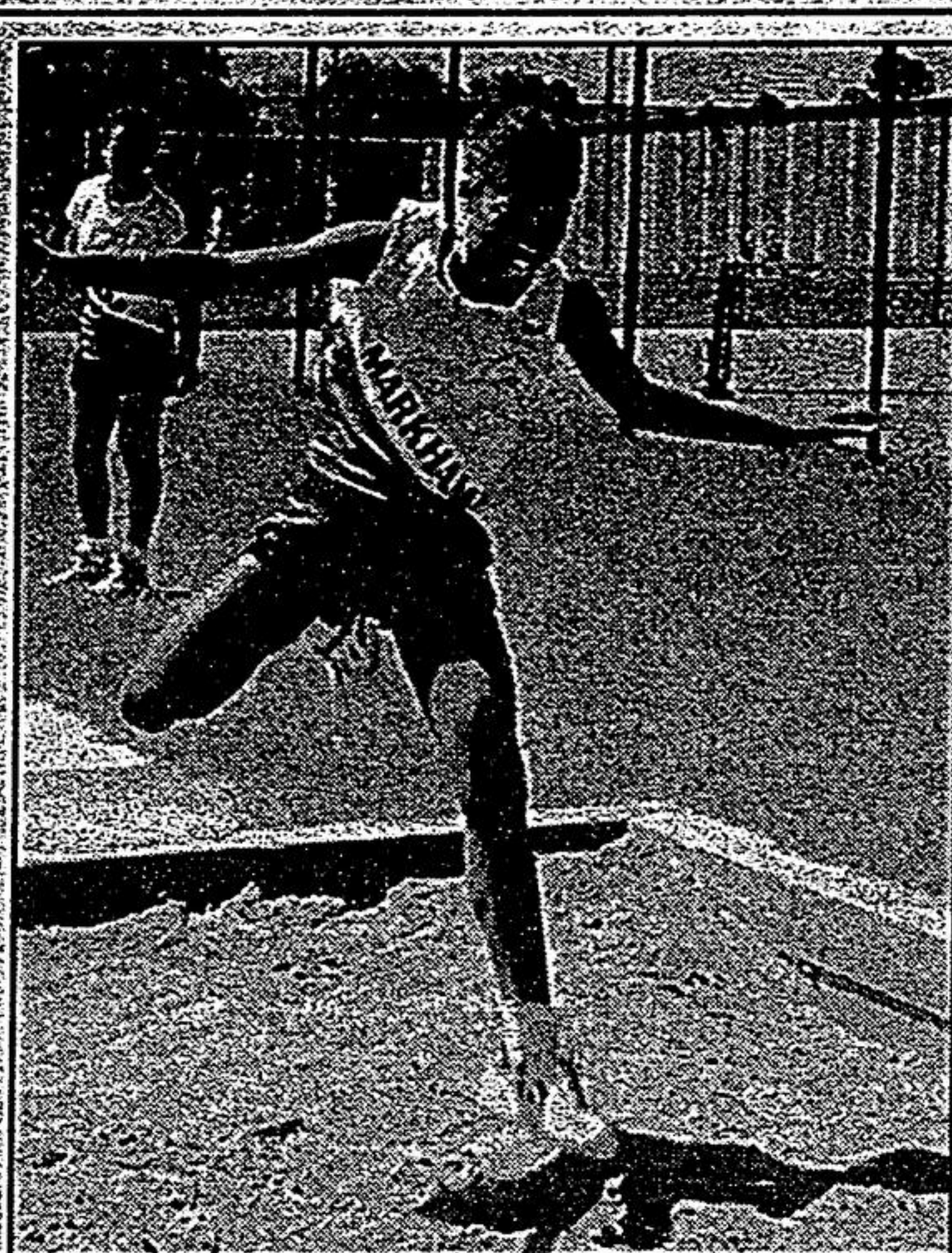

# Isaacs running off to Sudbury

A Whitchurch-Stouffville athlete will be out to extend her winning streak when she travels to Sudbury for the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Association (OFSAA) Track and Field Championships on Friday.

Tamiko Isaacs, a student at Langstaff Secondary School in Thornhill, took the gold in two of the three events in which she competed at last week's Central Region Track and Field OFSAA qualifier in Oshawa.

Isaacs won both the 100-metre and 200m midget girls' finals, and came within a technicality of challenging for first in the high jump.

Isaacs took the gold in the 100m and 200m races, as well as the high jump at the York Region Athletic Association (YRAA) Track and Field Championships the previous week. Her efforts earned her the Overall Midget Girls Award at the meet.

Isaacs covered the 100m distance in a fleet 13:01 seconds at the YRAA finals, and sprinted the 200m race in a mere 26:49. Her jump of 1.66m in the high jump established a YRAA record.

# Jamieson top triathlete at Shadow Lake event

The second annual Shadow Lake Camp Triathlon attracted roughly 200 athletes from children through seniors Saturday.

The triathlon was staged amid picture perfect weather conditions in Shadow Lake and on surrounding roads as participants swam, cycled and ran their way through five separate events.

Chris Jamieson of Bridgenorth was the overall winner of the triathlon event, which included 123 athletes. Jamieson completed the 800-metre swim, 28 km cycle, 8 km run in a time of one hour, 19 minutes and 56 seconds. He was competing in the junior men's (under 20) category.

Larry Bobbett was the top placing Stouffville entrant with a time of 1:34:45. Bobbett was second in the men's 50-54 group, and 31st overall.

Dave Perry of Stouffville was third in the men's 50-54 flight, and 40th overall.

Kingston's Julie Curwin captured the women's event with a time of 1:29:13. She was competing in the women's 30-34 class.

Bowmanville's Andrew O'Toole finished first in a field of 34 in the duathlon, which included a

1.2 km run, a 28 km cycle, followed by a second run of eight km. O'Toole covered the distance in 1:18:20.

Stouffville's Kim Kavluk was fourth overall, and second in the men's 40-44 group, with a time of 1:24:21.

Tory Wilgar of Toronto was the top finishing woman with a time of 1:38:43. She competed in the women's 30-34 class.

Eight athletes took part in the Surf & Turf event, which included an 800-m swim and an eight km run.

Waterloo's Peter Hodgson was first overall at 1:39:52. Burlington's Laura Wagland was the first place women finisher.

The Friendship Wave saw 27 athletes aged 15 and under work their way through a 200 m swim, 10 km cycle and two km run. Nine children took part in the Youth Wave.

The event was put on by Great Lakes Multi-Sport Series as a means of raising awareness for Shadow Lake Camp, which is a home for the developmentally challenged.
