

# Pony Club jumper show rides into town Sunday

A Stouffville area equestrian centre is to be the site of the first of three Central Ontario Region Show Jumping Qualifiers on Sunday.

The event is to be hosted by the Pause Awhile Equestrian Centre starting at 9 a.m. The show will see contestants competing at the starter, beginner, novice, intermediate and advanced lev-

els, as well as non-qualifying classes for entry level riders. Qualifier divisions in the show consist of three classes - a speed class and two conventional classes. Each is to be run over a different course.

Points earned at the show will go towards deciding who represents the Central Ontario Region at this year's Ontario Pony

Club Tournament of Champions. Cumulative points totals from the three jumper show to be held this season will be used to decide who advances. The other two qualifying shows are to be held later in the season in Ajax and Elliott Lake. The Pause Awhile facility, formerly known as Zweibrucken, is located on McCowan Rd. south of Bloomington Sideroad.

ending double play.

"Our defence played well," said Rebels coach Frank Hendy. "And Paul (Koert) pitched a great game."

Hendy said his hitters continue to pounce on opposing pitchers. "The boys are hitting well. We're scoring lots of runs. That makes it easy to coach."

The win, the second in a row for the Rebels, upped the Claremont team's season record to four wins and two defeats.

The Rebels were scheduled to play the Oshawa Juniors Tuesday night in Oshawa, but the game was postponed due to rain.

The Claremont club, which is at home to Port Perry on June 10, takes on the Stouffville Mennos in Stouffville on June 11.

Hendy said he expects a good-sized crowd in Stouffville for that game when Koert, who played with that town's midgets last season, draws the pitching assignment.

The coach said the Mennos, who are near the bottom of the heap in the Campbell Division standings with a record of two wins and three losses have nowhere to go but up.

"They won't be at the bottom for long," said Hendy. "They're a great bunch of guys."
