### Summer Reading Program

## THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

### 1. STOP UP, CLOSE AND REMOVAL OF THE PLEASANTVILLE CURVE AND THE RECONSTRUCTION OF VIVIAN ROAD (Y.R. 74) FROM HIGHWAY 404 TO WOODBINE AVENUE (Y.R. 8), TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE

- the widening and reconstruction of Vivian Road (Y.R. 74) from Highway 404 to Woodbine Avenue (Y.R. 8) in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville to a basic width of 36.0 metres;
- the stop up and closure of the Pleasantville curve (Y.R. 74A) from Vivian Road (Y.R. 74) to Woodbine Avenue (Y.R. 8) in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville effective October 1, 1999;
- the removal of the Pleasantville curve (Y.R. 74A) which connects Vivian Road (Y.R. 74) with Woodbine Avenue (Y.R. 8);
- the installation of permanent traffic control signals at the intersection of Vivian Road (Y.R. 74) and Woodbine Avenue (Y.R. 8);
- the carrying out of all related works and undertakings in connection with the above; and
- the acquisition and disposition of the necessary lands and interests in lands for the works described above.

Pursuant to section 300 of the *Municipal Act*, the Transportation and Works Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 10:00 a.m. on the 17th day of June, 1998, in Committee Room "A" at the Regional Administrative Building located at 17250 Yonge Street, Newmarket, hear any person who claims that his/her lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard. Anyone wishing to be heard is requested to advise the Office of the Regional Clerk, attention Doris Sue (telephone 895-1231 or 731-0201, ext. 1303) if any party entitled to be heard does not attend at the hearing, the Committee may proceed in his/her absence and he/she will not be entitled to any further notice in the proceedings.

The proposed by-law and plans showing the proposed works may be inspected at the office of Brian Harrison, Director, Design and Construction Branch, at the Transportation and Works Department located at the Regional Administrative Building at 17250 Yonge Street, Newmarket (telephone 895-1200 or 764-6345, ext. 5088).
