## Jazz greats unite

Local crowd-pleaser Jay Douglas will be appearing with the man who invented reggae this weekend at the Toronto DuMaurier Jazz Festival.

Douglas will combine the talents of the Jay Douglas All Star Band with Ernest Ranglin, the man who traveled with and taught Bob Marley.

Ranglin has literally helped shape the course of Jamaican music. His melodies are the type felt deep down in the soul.

The harmonizing of Douglas and Ranglin promises a musical feast for the audience.

Over the years, Ranglin has been creating exceptional music as a jazz guitar player, and he's known as one of the pioneering spirits behind the "ska" sound.

Ranglin has cut several records with American pop star Johnny Nash and has toured with Jimmy Cliff throughout the US, Europe

and the Far East before resuming his jazz career in 1973.

In 1996 Ranglin started performing as guest artist at various jazz festivals in London, England, astounding audiences and critics alike when he played two nights at London's Jazz Cafe.

The teaming of Ranglin and Douglas, both Jamaican-born talents, seems almost inevitable. They have shared a love of music for decades, and both have traveled world-wide to deliver their music to the people.

Douglas' dream of developing and exposing young talent in Ontario comes alive with this opportunity to bring a reggae/jazz legend to Toronto, and he hopes to invite Ranglin to Markham some time in the near future, to give local youth a taste of this musical genius.
