# Flu Attack haunts girls in Cup tourney

The York Attack will be looking to go over the top this Thursday evening.

The Stouffville-based under-13 girls' rep soccer team hosts Barrie in their final game of the Central Girls Soccer League season.

The Attack, who have been a half step behind Etobicoke all season long in the chase for first place, would finally overtake their West Toronto rivals with a win Thursday at the Whitchurch-Highlands Public School field.

"If we make first place in our first year in the league, that would be phenomenal," said Attack coach Alfons Rubbens, whose team goes into the final match boasting a record of 8-2. Both Attack losses have come at the hands of Etobicoke.

The Attack were ousted from the Central league's Cup championship playdowns when they were blanked 3-0 by Newmarket Sunday in Scarborough. The York squad was forced to play with the minimum 11 players, with five of the girls suffering from the flu.

"It was a very tough grind," said Rubbens. "That was almost more goals than we've given up all season."

Rubbens credited his flu-ridden players for trying to play.

"I appreciated the fact the girls showed up at all, but they could barely walk. It was a shame because we beat Newmarket handily earlier in the season. But that's how it goes."

The loss eliminated the Attack from Cup championship contention.

The Attack won their Cup opener on Saturday by default when their Scarborough Olympic Flame opponents failed to show up. The Flame also failed to field a complete team for a league contest scheduled for last Thursday in Scarborough. The Attack won that game by default as well.

### Rubbens to assist in reviving rep program

Rubbens has asked to meet with Whitchurch-Stouffville Soccer Club officials to help assemble a plan to revive the club's rep program. The veteran rep level coach believes there is great potential for the program with all the interest being shown in the game here in recent years.

He said the program can only succeed if enough qualified coaches and supportive parents can be found.

"You need the people who are committed. It would be nice to see Stouffville get back into the competitive swing of things," said Rubbens, who had considerable success with boys' rep soccer teams at the York Region level in the 1980's and early 1990's.
