Burglar cleans up

This Stouffville thief has a clean streak.

Police reported that an unknown intruder gained entry to a Main Street home sometime Sunday.

The suspect proceeded to take a shower and eventually made off with a bath towel.

Theft value is \$10. There was no damage.

Men nabbed for drug possession

Two men are charged with possession of heroin after officers approached them because they were acting suspiciously.

The men, 19 and 20, were on Denison Street near Warden Avenue when officers observed them acting suspiciously, said York Regional Police Det. Sgt. Bruce Powley.

Officers discovered drug paraphernalia as well as two small chunks of heroin. They were arrested on the spot, charged with one count each of possession of an illegal substance.

The 19-year-old also faces two counts of breach of probation and was held in custody. The 20-year-old was released.

Both are to appear in Newmarket Provincial Court Sept. 23.

Teen robbed of video game

A 15-year-old was pushed, threatened with a knife and robbed of his Playstation by three youths.

Police said the teen was walking on Aldergrove Drive near Digby Crescent in Milliken when he was approached by the three suspects about 2:30 on Aug. 3.

After he handed over his \$230 Sony Playstation, the youths fled on foot. The victim was not injured.

Police seek fraud suspect

Police are closing in on a suspect wanted for defrauding Co-operator's Insurance of more than \$19,000.

Police said the suspect claimed lost wages in March, 1997 following a motor vehicle accident. The company paid, but has since learned the man was unemployed at the time.

House break-ins reported

More than \$2,800 cash, in Canadian, U.S. and Hong Kong currency, was stolen from a Ridley Crescent home Saturday.

Thugs forced the front door at about 2 p.m. Cash, a ladies watch, a laser disc, identification and credit cards were also taken.

Damage to the door is \$200.

Also on Saturday, about half an hour earlier, unknown culprits forced the rear basement window of a Bakendale Road home. Jewelry and camera equipment valued at \$14,300 were removed.

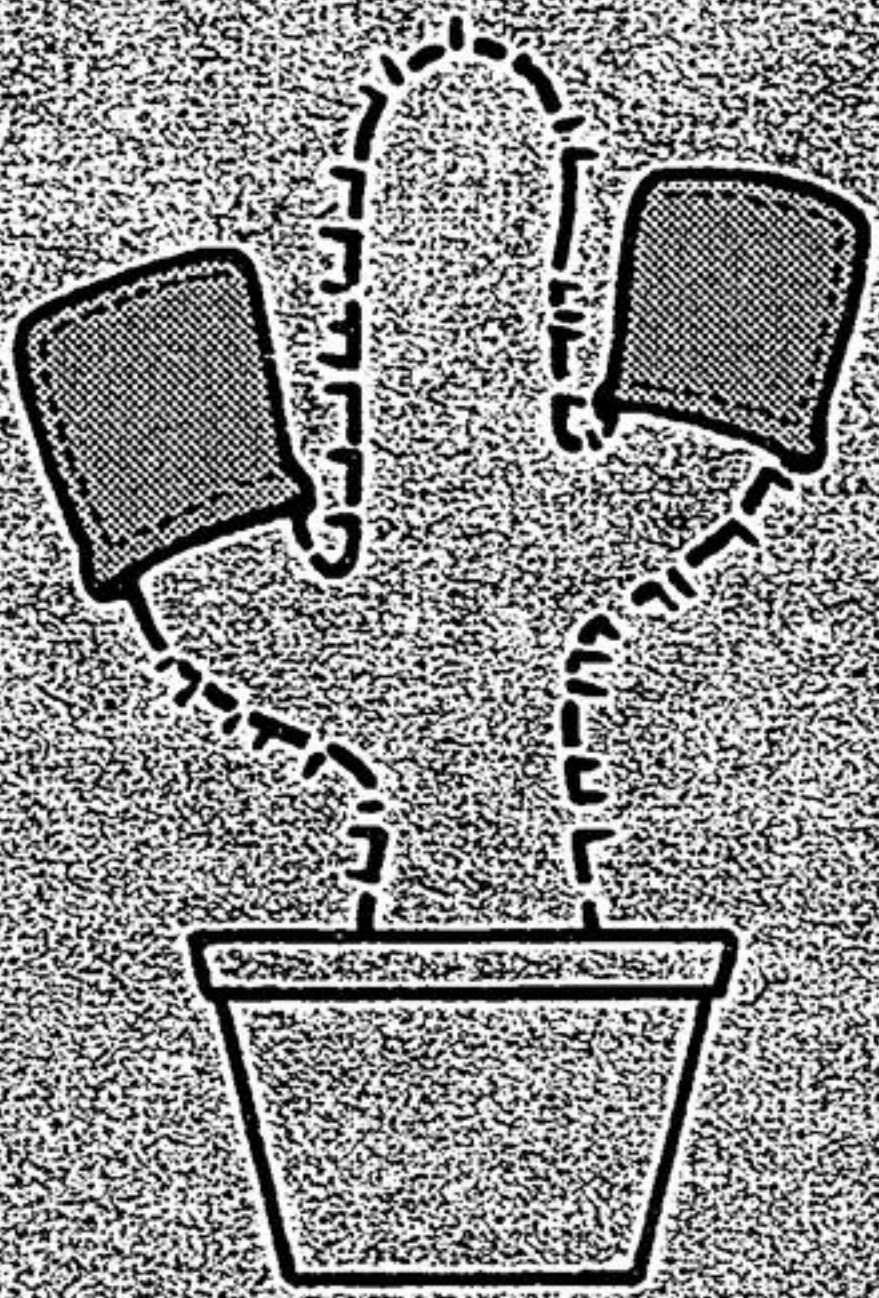
