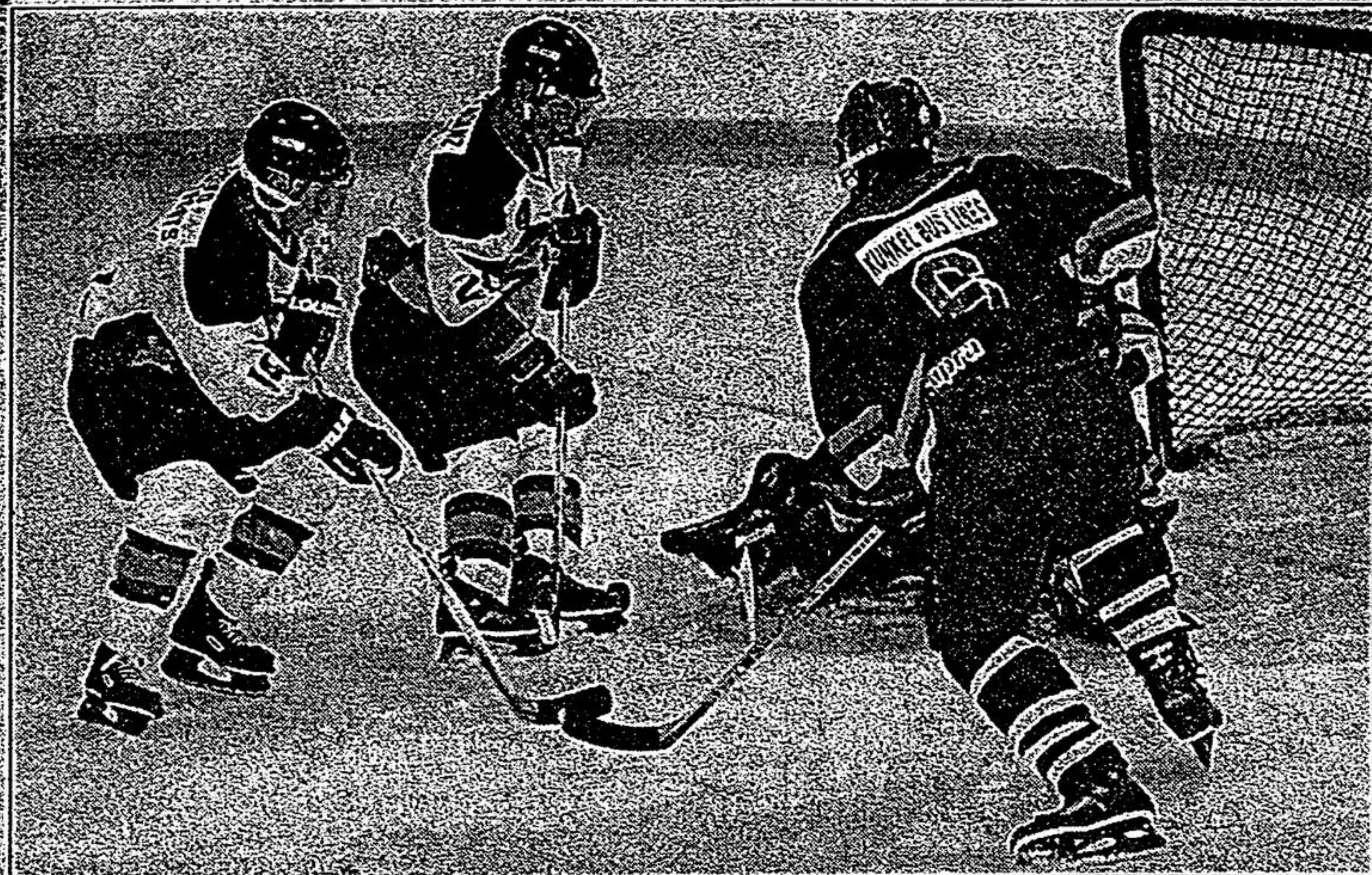

Bruins hope for a Spirited association

The Uxbridge Bruins are hoping for a strong sense of déjà vu as they prepare for the upcoming season.

The Central Ontario Junior C Hockey club is looking to an affiliation agreement signed with the Spirit of Stouffville of the Provincial Junior A Hockey League to bring about a return to the days when Bruins' team rosters came with a strong Stouffville flavour.

Bruins general manager Ron Archibald said the new arrangement has resulted in a dramatic increase of Stouffville and Uxbridge area players looking to crack the Bruins lineup for the 1998-99 season.

"We had as many as 46 kids at training camp the first week and 18-20 of them were Uxbridge and Stouffville kids," said Archibald. "That has really sent the message out that local players are looking at us as a viable option."

Stouffville minor hockey product Cory Turchan, 18, was the first Stouffville player to be signed by the Bruins. Brett Jennings and Peter Mabley, also of Stouffville, were in the Bruins lineup when they were edged 4-2 by the Gravenhurst Cubs in the Uxbridge team's recent exhibition game at the Uxbridge Arena.

"The Stouffville boys played well," noted Archibald. The general manager feels the association with the Spirit has been greeted positively by everyone involved.

"The response from the public is that it should have been done a long time ago. It gives local kids from both towns a chance to play with our team for a year and if they excel, move up to the Junior A team closest to their home the next year."

Under the arrangement certain Bruins players will see spot duty with the Spirit throughout the season, giving them a taste of Junior A hockey.
