(a site). It's closed in and it is not obnoxious," Landon said.

The host community could be financially compensated, he said. "Also, it would create employment."

During the past month, Landon has been visiting York's municipalities and presenting the need for this facility in the hopes of getting region-wide support.

"Things like truck modifications, changes to collection schedules and new education programs would be needed to ensure the waste is properly

separated into wet and dry before being taken to the integrated facility for recycling and composting," he said.

When Landon addressed Whitchurch-Stouffville council last month, he pointed out in 25 years when York's population skyrockets to more than 1.1 million people, the region will be generating 384,000 tonnes of waste.

"While we have a limited time to implement our full strategy, we want to ensure the media and the public have ample time to engage in the process."

The region will ask firms to bid on running the waste facility, he said.

yesterday morning, Ontario English Catholic Teachers Association president Ihor Baczynsky is doubtful a deal can be reached now.

"I think there could have been a York Region deal," said Baczynsky on Friday. "Maybe the school board will come back to us for meaningful discussions with the legislation in their pockets."

The legislation will probably subject school boards and unions to binding arbitration, in which an independent third party listens to offers from both sides and then draws up a comprehensive agreement.

"Our union offered all Catholic school boards binding arbitration in early September and were turned down. From our perspective, we are not afraid of it," Baczynsky said.

"It becomes a political football, since everyone is pulling the legislation this way and that. But it's anybody's guess this time, because it's uncharted waters with Bill 160."

The Catholic board has promised elementary teachers no changes to their existing contract for the next two years, including the protection of 556 non-classroom instructors.

However, high school teachers have been scheduled to instruct an additional period each day to meet the province's requirements of average class sizes of 22 students and a minimum average instruction time of 1,250 minutes a week.

The teachers have requested a 6.5 per cent salary increase, plus the cost of living hike, over the next two years.

"We would rather find a local deal, but the legislation is a good move," board vice-chairperson Elizabeth Crowe said. "Whether the legislation passes in three days or three months, there's at least an end in sight."
